The Commonwealth awards communities with funding to complete vulnerability assessments and develop action-oriented resiliency plans. Communities who complete the MVP Planning Grant program become certified as an MVP community and are eligible for MVP Action Grant funding and other opportunities.

- EEA's Division of Conservation Services Upcoming Grant Opportunities:
  - The Drinking Water Supply Protection Grant Program's (DWSP) FY23 Grant Round is now open. The DWSP grant program provides financial assistance to public water systems and municipal water departments for the purchase of land or interests in land for the protection of existing DEP-approved public drinking water supplies, protection of planned future public drinking water supplies, or groundwater recharge.
