Incorporate the National Career Readiness Certificate

The National Career Readiness Certificate (NCRC) provides an accurate measurement of what an individual can do, rather than what they know. It is a portable, industry-recognized credential that verifies "work readiness."

Over 20 years ago, businesses came to ACT requesting a national, portable certificate that could measure essential workplace skills and be a reliable predictor of workplace success. After completing 20,000 job profiles, ACT found that over 95% of the occupations required verification of three foundational skills: Applied Mathematics, Locating Information and Reading for Information. The NCRC documents work-related skills using an applied skills approach to the assessment. It helps employers hire, train and retain qualified employees and helps applicants stand out by demonstrating the skills employers need.
