Petit Needham LLC dba Petit Robert Bistro (the "Licensee") holds an alcohol license issued pursuant to M.G.L. c. 138, §12. The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission (the "Commission") held a hearing on Tuesday, June 12, 2012, regarding an alleged violation of 204 CMR 2.05 (2), to wit: M.G.L. c. 138, §34. Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the licensee stipulated to the violation alleged in Investigator Carey's Compliance Check Field Report.

FACTS

- 1. On Monday, March 5, 2012, at approximately 5:22 p.m., Investigators Teehan and Carey conducted an investigation of the business operation of Petit Needham LLC dba Petit Robert Bistro.
- 2. An underage operative working with investigators purchased an alcoholic beverage, a Kronenbourg beer, for five dollars (\$5.00). The underage operative was not asked for identification.

CONCLUSION

Based on the evidence, the Commission finds the licensee violated 204 CMR 2.05 (2), to wit: M.G.L. c. 138, §34. Therefore, the Commission suspends the license for three (3) days of which three (3) days will be held in abeyance for a period of two (2) years provided no further violations of Chapter 138 or Commission Regulations occur.
