Andrews Dahill Post 1531 dba Vets of Foreign Wars Of U.S. Inc. (the "Licensee") holds an alcohol license issued pursuant to M.G.L. c. 138, §12. The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission (the "Commission") held a hearing on Tuesday, September 11, 2012, regarding an alleged violation of 204 CMR 2.05 (2), to wit: M.G.L. c.138 §23- Sale of an alcoholic beverages other than those purchased under §18 or §19 or from a holder of a special permit under §22A (48 counts). Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the licensee stipulated to the violation alleged in Investigator Kenny's Report.

The following documents and physical items are in evidence:

- . 1. Licensee's Stipulation of Facts;
 - 2. Investigator Kenny's Investigative Report dated April 5, 2012; and
 - 3. Forty-eight (48) bottles of alcoholic beverages.

There is one (1) audio recording of this hearing.

FACTS

- 1. On Thursday, April 5, 2012, at approximately 8:00 p.m., Investigators Binienda and Kenny conducted an investigation of Andrews Dahill Post 1531 dba Vets of Foreign Wars Of U.S. Inc. to determine the manner in which their business was being conducted.
- 2. Investigators spoke to the bartender on duty, Patrice Flynn, identified themselves and advised him that they would conduct an inspection of the premises.
- 3. While inspecting the liquor storage room investigators observed three (3) boxes of Barefoot wine with labels from Shawmut Package Store.
- 4. Investigators observed that two (2) of the boxes each contained twenty-four (24) individual 187 ml bottles, and one box was empty.
- 5. Investigators informed Mr. Flynn of the violations and that a report would be submitted to the Chief Investigator for further review.

CONCLUSION

Based on the evidence, the Commission finds the licensee violated of 204 CMR 2.05 (2), to wit: M.G.L. c.138 §23- Sale of an alcoholic beverages other than those purchased under §18 or §19 or from a holder of a special permit under §22A (48 counts). Therefore, the Commission suspends the license for eleven (11) days of which eleven (11) days will be held in abeyance for a period of two (2) years provided no further violations of Chapter 138 or Commission Regulations occur.
