Swamini LLC dba Zully's Wine & Spirits (the "Licensee") holds an alcohol license issued pursuant to M.G.L. c. 138, §15. The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission (the "Commission") held a hearing on Wednesday, December 17, 2014, regarding an alleged violation of Ch. 138, §34 - Sale or Delivery of an alcoholic beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age (1 Count). commencement of the hearing, the licensee stipulated to the violation alleged in Investigator Velez's Report.

The following documents are in evidence:

- 1. Licensee's Stipulation of Facts;
- 2. Investigator Velez's Investigative Report dated October 9, 2014; and
- 3. License printout of the underage patron.

There is one (1) audio recording of this hearing.

FACTS

- 1. On Thursday, October 9, 2014 at approximately 9:30 p.m., Investigators Binienda, Carey and Velez were conducting surveillance of the above licensed premises.
- While outside of the licensed premises, Investigators observed a youthful looking male carrying an 18-pack of Busch beer and a brown paper bag. After the Investigators' inspection, the following contents were later identified as 2 40oz bottles of Colt 45 beer. The male individual was later identified as Taylor Cacciola of Dedham, MA, Drivers' License # date of birth (age 20).
- 3. Investigator Binienda asked to see proof of legal drinking age, at which point Mr. Cacciola presented Investigator Binienda with a fake Oregon ID bearing his own name with an address in Salem, OR, and a date of birth of (age 22).
- 4. Investigators Carey and Velez entered the licensed premises and spoke to the clerk on duty, identified as Drew Geier.
- 5. Investigators informed the clerk that a violation has occurred and a violation report would be submitted to the Chief Investigator for further action.

CONCLUSION

Based on the evidence, the Commission finds the licensee violated Ch. 138, §34 – Sale or Delivery of an alcoholic beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age (1 Count). Therefore, the Commission suspends the license for three (3) days of which three (3) days will be held in abeyance for a period of two (2) years provided no further violations of Chapter 138 or Commission Regulations occur.
