**DECISION**

**PARKER RIVER INC. DBA PARKER RIVER PUB & GRILLE**  
**9 FRUIT STREET**  
**NEWBURY, MA 01922**  
**LICENSE#: 079400001**

**HEARING DATE: 06/02/2015**

Parker River Inc. dba Parker River Pub & Grille (the "Licensee") holds an alcohol license issued pursuant to M.G.L. c. 138, §12. The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission (the "Commission") held a hearing on Tuesday, June 2, 2015, regarding an alleged violation of 204 CMR 2.05 (2) – Permitting an illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: c. 138, §34 – Sale or delivery of an alcoholic beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age. Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the Licensee stipulated to the violation alleged in Investigator Doyle's Report.

The following documents are in evidence:

1. Investigator Doyle's Compliance Check Field Report dated March 30, 2015; and
2. Licensee's Stipulation of Facts.

There is one (1) audio recording of this hearing.

The Commission took Administrative Notice of the Licensee's record.

**FACTS**

1. On Monday, March 30, 2015, at approximately 7:31 p.m., Investigators Bailey and Doyle conducted an investigation of the business operation Parker River Inc. dba Parker River Pub & Grille.
2. While on the licensed premises an underage operative working with investigators purchased from the Licensee an alcoholic beverage, a bottle of Budweiser Light beer, for three dollars and twenty-five cents (\$3.25). The underage operative was not asked for identification.



CONCLUSION

Based on the evidence, the Commission finds the Licensee violated 204 CMR 2.05 (2) – Permitting an illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: c. 138, §34 – Sale or delivery of an alcoholic beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age. Therefore, the Commission **suspends the license for three (3) days of which three (3) days will be held in abeyance for a period of two (2) years provided no further violations of Chapter 138 or Commission Regulations occur.**
