DECISION

CONNELLY AND JEWETT LLC DBA THE THIRSTY WHALE
24 MARKET SQUARE
NEWBURYPORT, MA 01950
LICENSE#: 079600009
VIOLATION DATE: 07/18/2013

Connelly and Jewett LLC dba The Thirsty Whale (the "Licensee") holds an alcohol license issued pursuant to M.G.L. c. 138, §12. The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission (the "Commission") held a hearing on Tuesday, November 19, 2013, regarding an alleged violation of 204 CMR 2.05 (2)-Permitting an Illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: c.138, §34C Person under the age of twenty-one (21) in possession of an alcoholic beverage. Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the licensee stipulated to the violation alleged in Investigator Kelleher's Report.

The following documents are in evidence:

1. Investigator Kelleher's Compliance Check Field Report dated July 18, 2013;
2. Licensee's Stipulation of Facts;
3. Massachusetts Driver's License for Lindsay Smith;
4. RMV Printout for Victoria Morris; and
5. Photograph of Victoria Morris inside the Licensed Premises.

There is one (1) audio recording of this hearing.

FACTS

1. On Thursday, July 18, 2013, Investigators Guarino and Kelleher conducted an investigation of the business operation of Connelly and Jewett LLC dba The Thirsty Whale.
2. While on premises, investigators' attention was drawn to a youthful looking female seated at the end of the bar.
3. Investigators observed the youthful looking female drinking a Corona beer.
4. Investigators approached this individual, identified themselves, and asked to see proof of legal drinking age.
5. The female individual provided investigators with a Massachusetts Driver's license in the name of Lindsay Smith, actual date of birth [REDACTED] (age 25).
6. Upon viewing the identification presented, investigators observed that the photo on the driver's license and the individual presenting it were not the same person.


7. Investigators questioned the female individual who provided them with her true name, Victoria Morris, actual date of birth [REDACTED] (age 20).
8. Ms. Morris confirmed that the identification presented belonged to a friend of hers, and that she had paid her friend \$80.00.
9. Investigators questioned the bartender on duty, Daniel Kenny, if he had requested to see the underage's identification.
10. Mr. Kenny stated that he did not request identification from Ms. Morris because the "bouncer was checking i.d.s at the door."
11. Mr. Kenny and Ms. Morris both stated that she had purchased one Corona beer for four dollars.
12. Investigators advised Mr. Kenny of the violation and that a report would be submitted to the Chief Investigator for review.

CONCLUSION

Based on the evidence, the Commission finds the licensee violated 204 CMR 2.05 (2) - Permitting an Illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: c.138, §34C Person under the age of twenty-one (21) in possession of an alcoholic beverage. Therefore, the Commission **suspends the license for three (3) days of which three (3) days will be held in abeyance for a period of two (2) years provided no further violations of Chapter 138 or Commission Regulations occur.**

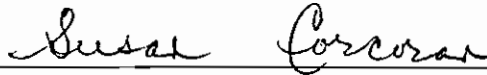
