The Massachusetts Department of Energy Resources (DOER) seeks public comment on its draft <u>Municipal Aggregation Manual and Best Practices Guide</u>. The Guide was developed in response to municipalities' increased interest in establishing municipal aggregations. It seeks to provide information that <u>supports the effective and efficient formation of municipal aggregations</u>, equips municipalities to advocate for municipal interests when forming a municipal aggregation, and improves collaboration with DOER on municipal aggregation formation.

ACEEE Offers Renter Energy Equity Toolkit

Local governments across the country are working to combat two crises at once: climate change and a lack of affordable housing. However, local government staff and stakeholders often tackle these issues separately. This toolkit offers guidance to local government staff and these stakeholder groups on how to integrate energy efficiency and affordable housing policy, thereby reducing greenhouse gas emissions and preserving or creating affordable housing.

The toolkit also discusses strategies for **financing and funding energy efficiency retrofits in affordable housing**; strategies to effectively engage property owners, buildings staff, and renters on energy efficiency; and, lastly, equity accountability measures that can help institutionalize equity-driven planning and program implementation.
