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Shattuck Clinical Services

- The Commonwealth is planning to move the medical and psychiatric services
 of the Lemuel Shattuck Hospital (LSH) from its campus in Jamaica Plain built
 in 1954 to the ENP, previously owned by Boston Medical Center, in the South
 End. The move is planned for 2024.
- The hospital's mission is to deliver compassionate medical and psychiatric care to patients requiring multi-disciplinary treatment and support to promote their health, well-being, rehabilitation and recovery. The hospital strives to continuously improve the quality of life for its patients through the delivery of collaborative treatment and patient-focused care.
- Shattuck Hospital has a longstanding commitment to the economically, racially and culturally diverse patients and communities that it serves.
- The hospital is operated by the Massachusetts Department of Public Health (DPH) in conjunction with the Department of Mental Health (DMH) and the Department of Correction (DOC).

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
Shattuck Clinical Services


- LSH currently provides 260 inpatient beds along with ambulatory care services largely provided for DOC and Houses of Corrections (HOCs) patients (primary care, orthopedics, radiology, diagnostics, etc.). These hospital services will be relocated to the ENP in 2024
- 270 Inpatient bed units planned for the ENP location:
 - 124 inpatient medical/surgical beds Operated by DPH
 - 115 inpatient psychiatric beds Operated by DMH
 - o 31 medical/surgical beds Dedicated to DOC/HOC patients
 - Clinical Services: Inpatient medical/surgical beds for DPH and DOC/HOC patients, DMH mental health services inpatient beds, Surgery, Radiology/Imaging, Cardiac/Pulmonary/Neuro Diagnostics, Dialysis, Ambulatory Care Clinics, Behavior Health Counseling, Chemotherapy Infusion, DOC/HOC exam rooms, Dental, Clinical Laboratory, Physical Therapy and Rehabilitation, and Pharmacy
- Private vendor provided services NOT moving from the Shattuck Morton Street JP campus to the ENP include:
 - Residential treatment programs
 - Pine Street shelter
 - Methadone clinic
















Site: Existing Traffic Pattern








Property Line

Construction Coordination - Operations

Work Period	Time Period	Delivery Period
Typical (Monday – Friday)	7:00AM – 6:00PM	7:00AM - 5:00PM
Saturday (by Permit Only)	7:00AM – 6:00PM	7:00AM – 5:00PM

- NO WORK, including equipment warm-up and truck queuing or idling, will be permitted at the site prior to 7:00 A.M.
- Maintaining truck routes to minimize traffic and noise



Construction Coordination - Site Safety and Security

Safety

- Keep all public and private roads and walks clear of debris
- Storage of materials and equipment will be confined within the secure project site
- Daily clean-up

Security

- Onsite Security during off hours and weekends
- Rounds will be conducted on both the interior and exterior
- Additional lighting at building to discourage trespassing
- Secure perimeter fence

Appropriate & compliant signage will be posted





Construction Coordination - Traffic

Worker Access & Parking

- No on-site parking
- Vehicles/equipment onsite will be for construction activities only
- Designated worker site access will be limited to one location for security purposes

Deliveries and Truck Routes

- Required to use major roadways or highways
- Minimize truck activity in the residential neighborhoods
- Sequenced, scheduled deliveries to avoid congestion
- Safety flaggers utilized during large deliveries



Construction Coordination - Measures

Dumpsters

- Always located within the construction staging area
- Secured with dust control measures
- Proper Fire Department Permits
- Frequent dumpster swaps to control general housekeeping

Snow Removal

- Remove snow from project site limits
- Immediate sidewalks are clear of snow and ice

Additional Measures

- Strictly enforce a no radio policy
- Professional conduct
- Drug testing
- Vibration Monitoring
