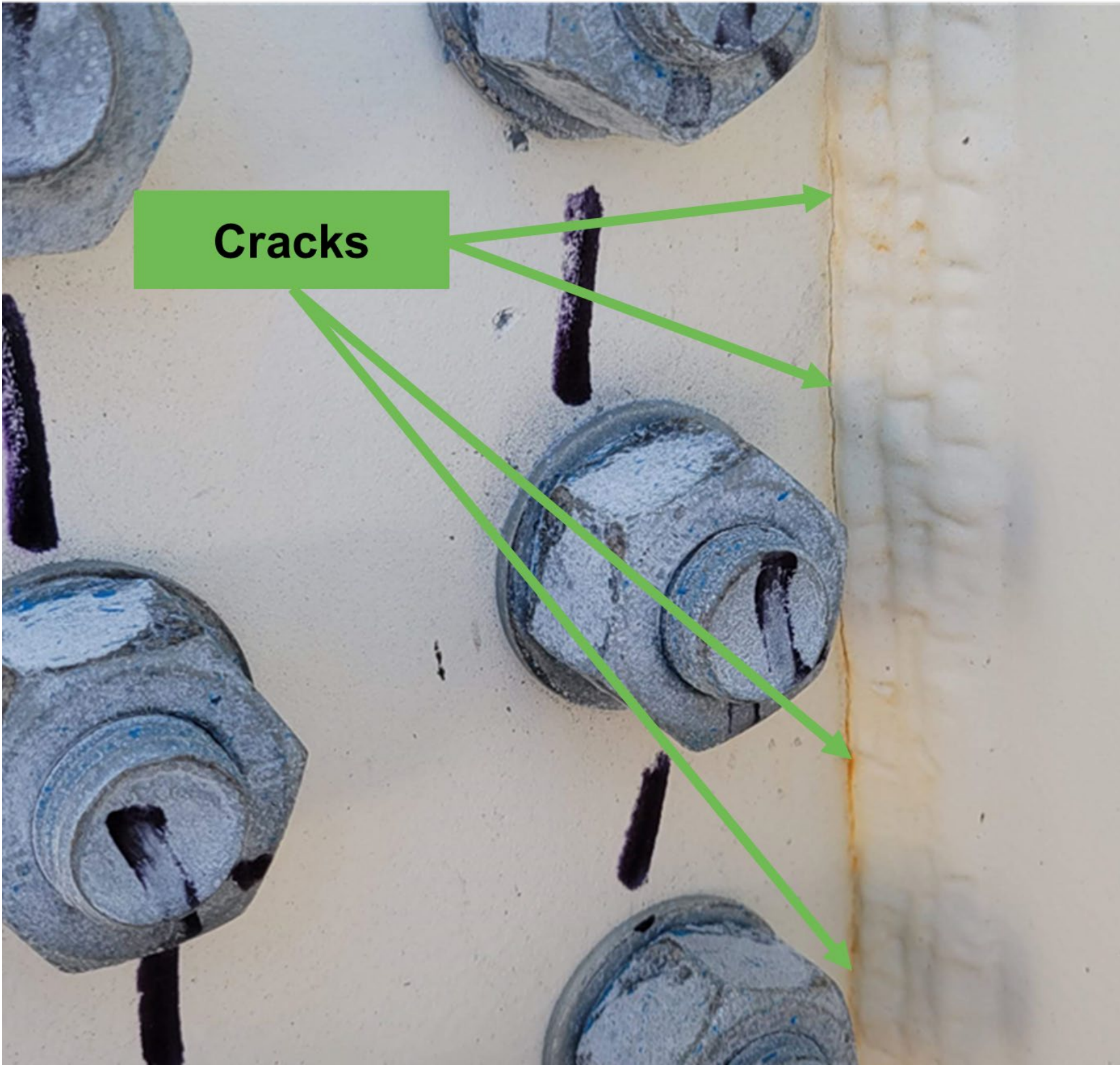
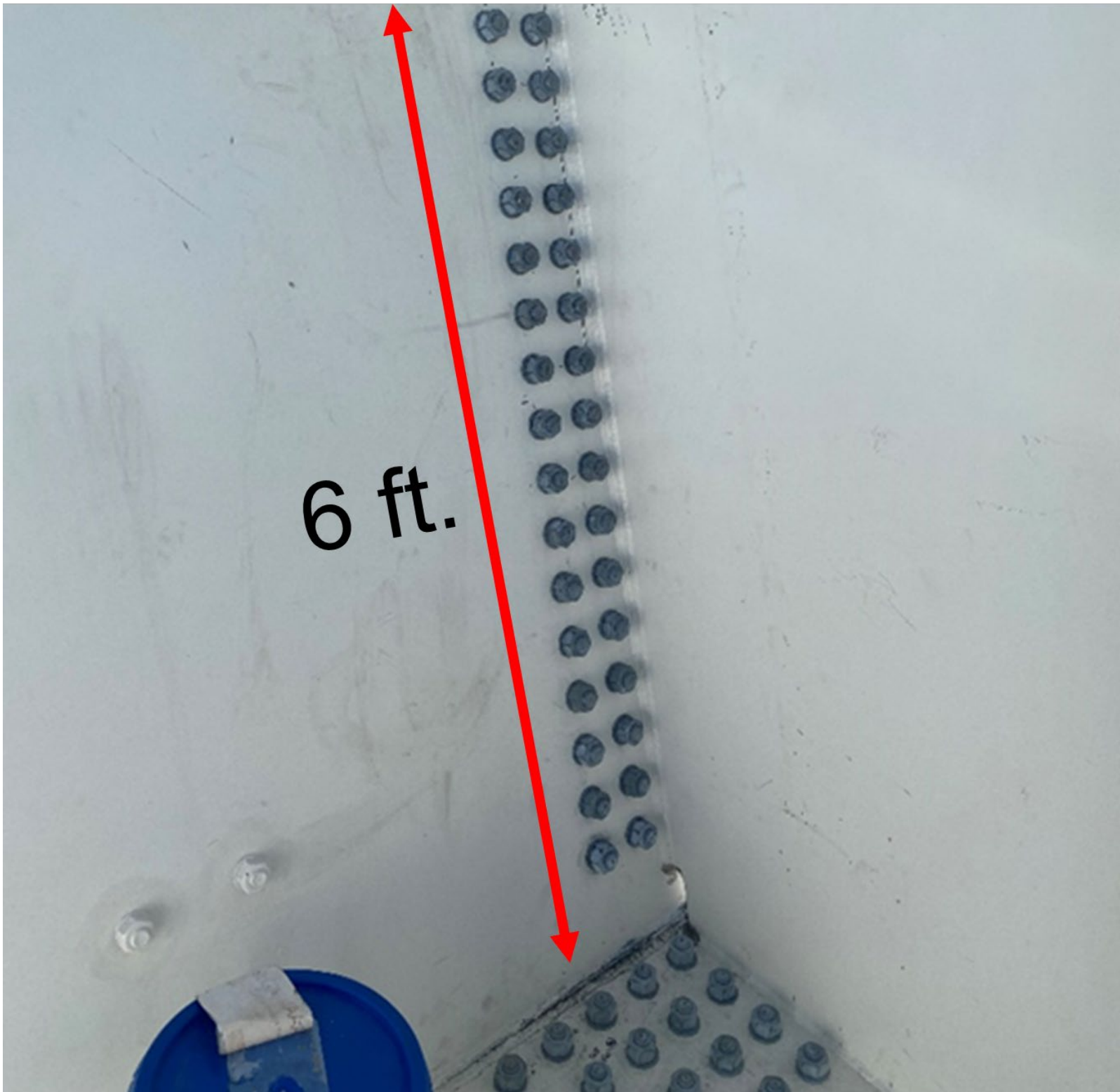
What We Have Done

- Piers for new bridge complete
- First elements of new bridge being built at City Square
- 60% of steel erected
- Structural work paused after MassDOT inspectors discovered 52 cracked welds at several connection points

What Caused The Pause?

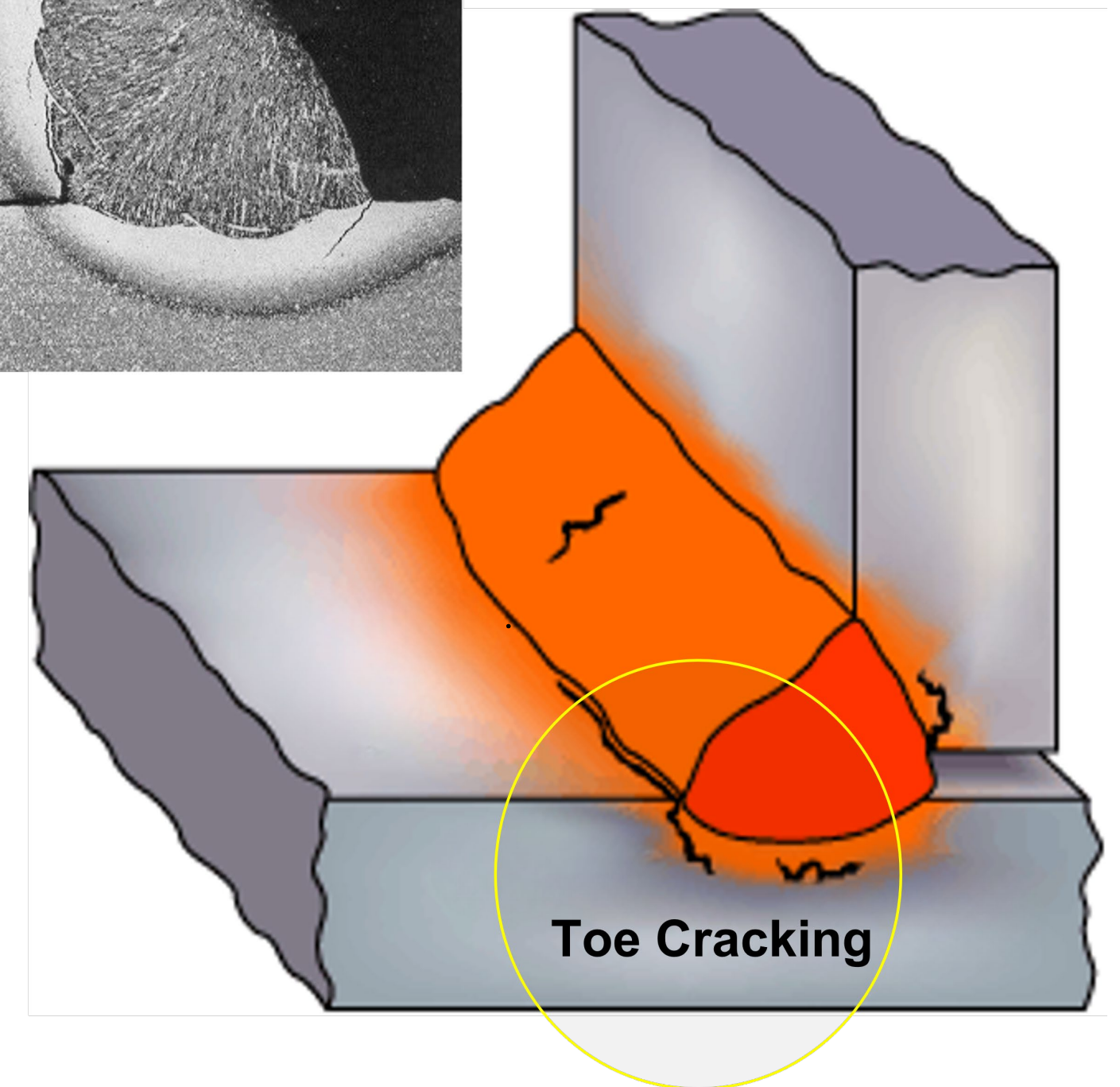
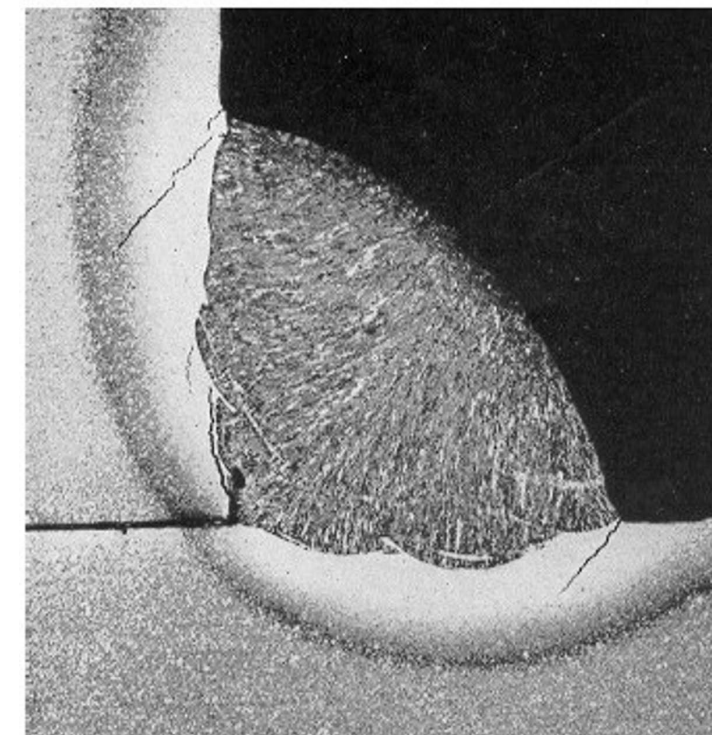


Example Crack



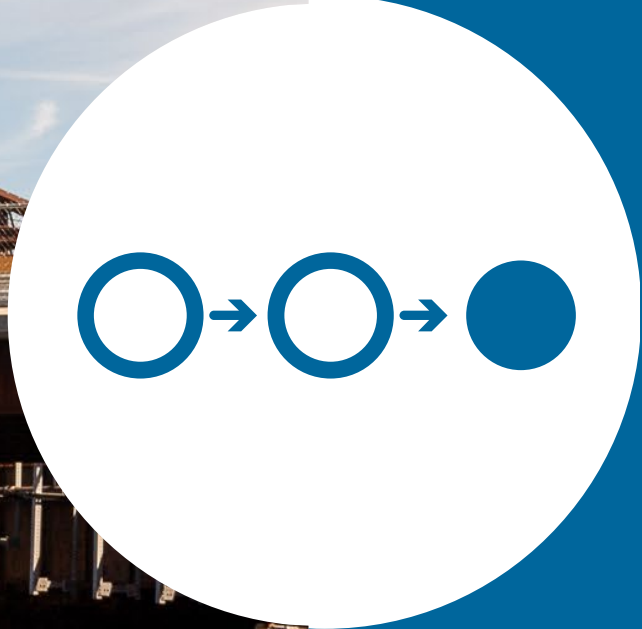
Why Are These Small Cracks So Serious and Caused Such A Long Delay?

- Known as Toe Cracking
- Small hairline cracks that expand over time
- Found in the field and at the fabricator
- Generally, appears a few days after fabrication and grows over time
- If not addressed steel would have greatly reduced strength capacity and structural integrity



Corrective Action Plan

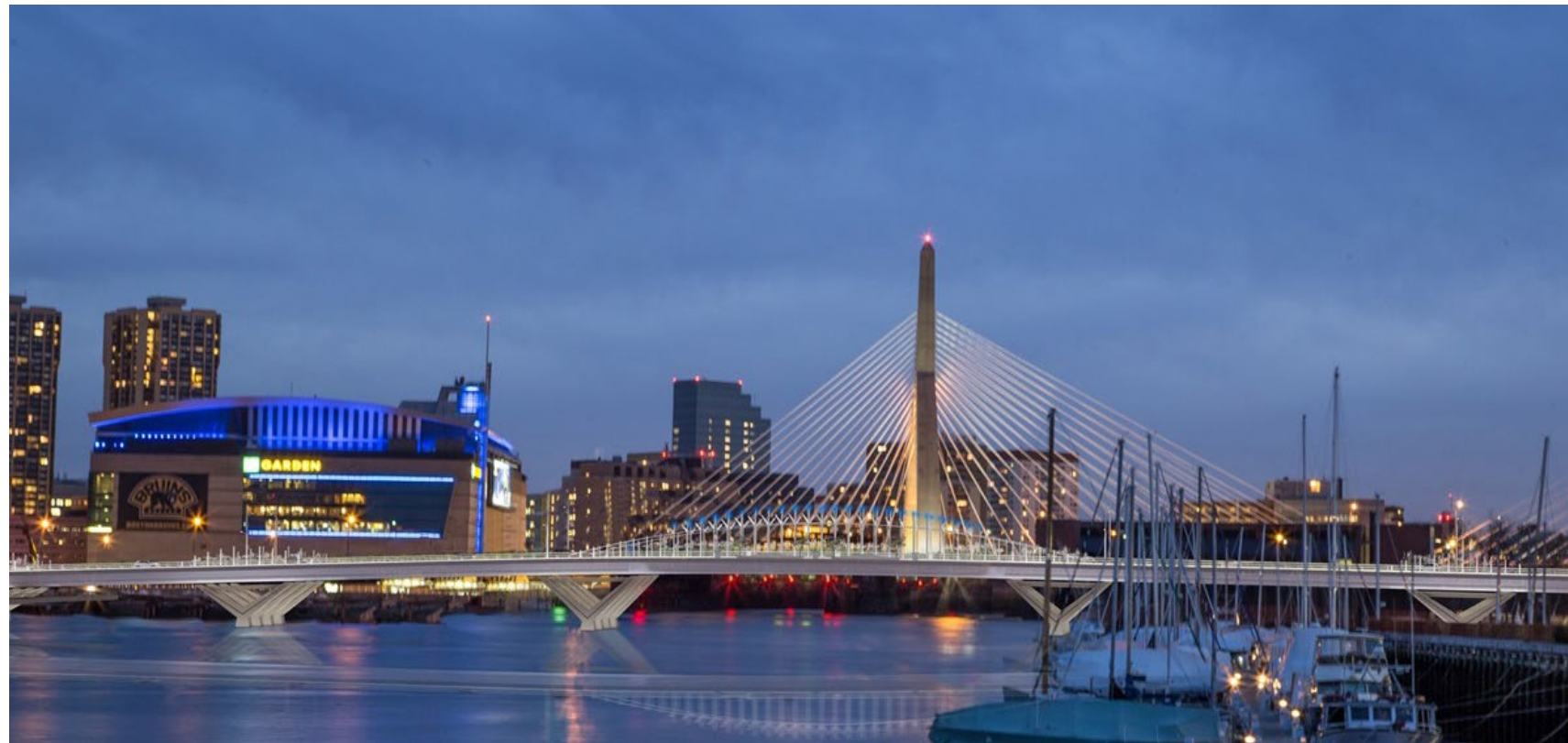
- MassDOT's investigation identified and mapped out 192 locations of welded connection points that are cracked or at risk of cracking
- The corrective action plan involves mapping/testing the cracks, removing paint from the cracks, repairing cracks if needed, heat treating, and repainting each of the 192 identified locations
- For the 52 identified connection points with cracks, these connection points are being rewelded in addition to above corrective actions

Current Estimated Project Milestones

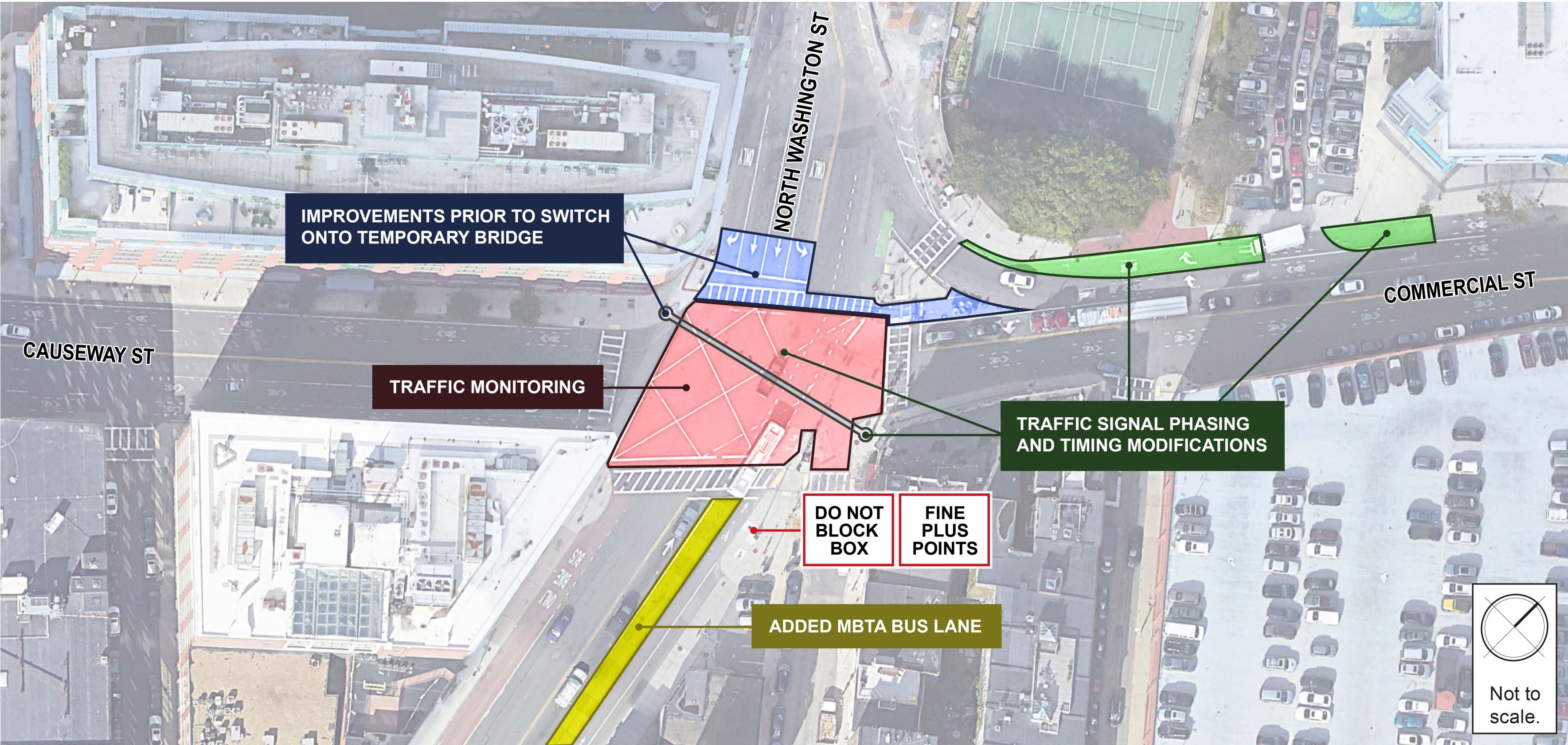
- Traffic switch to new bridge: December 2023

- Contract Complete: March 2025



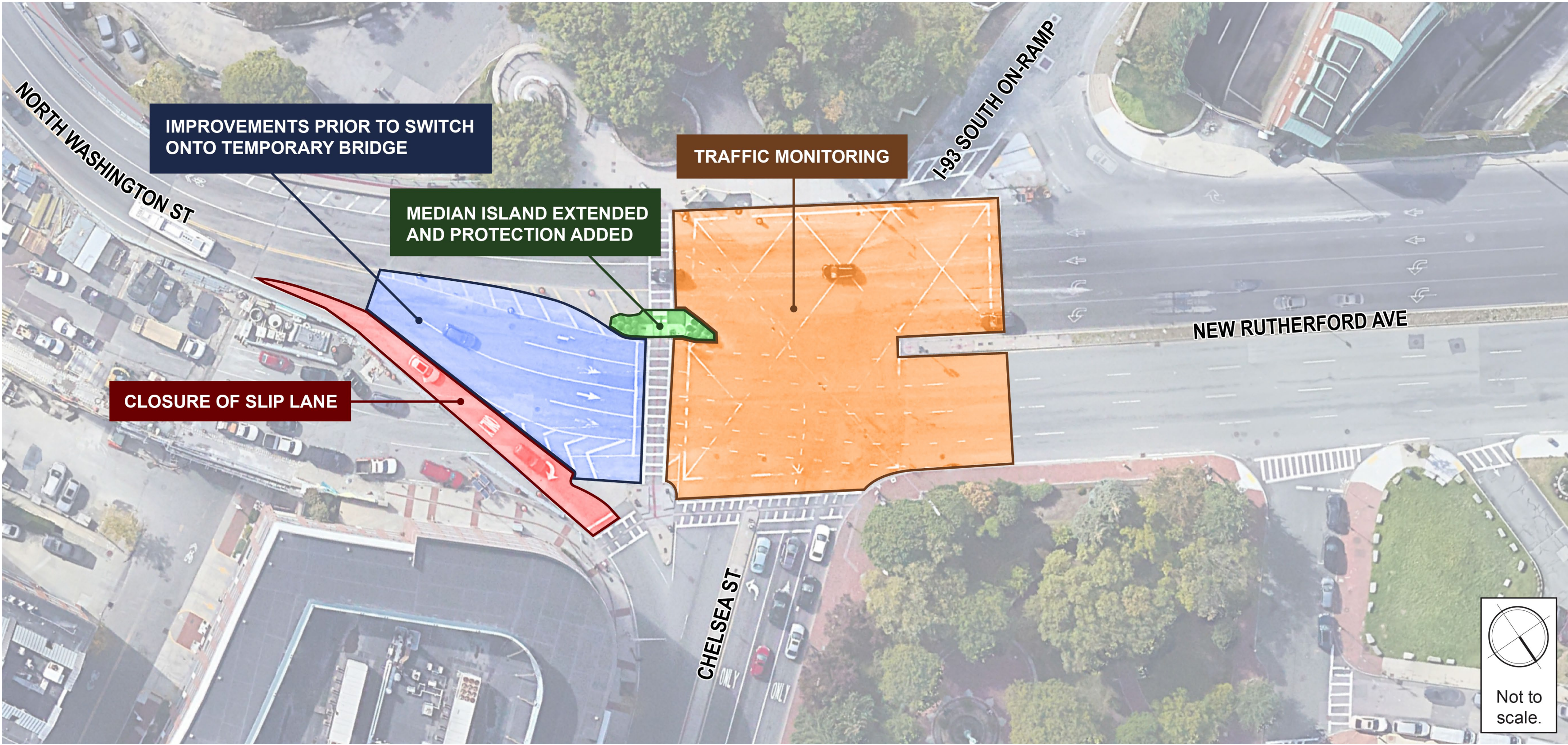
