RE: Northampton Community Compact--Climate Change Mitigation & Adaption Best Practices

Dear Mr. Cronin,

On behalf of the City of Northampton, we are updating you on how we are addressing the *Community Compact Best Practices for Climate Change Mitigation and Adaptation*.

Climate Mitigation

First, we are working on our *Northampton Climate Resiliency and Regeneration Plan*, to guide our mitigation efforts. We have updated our Greenhouse Gas Inventory, held several stakeholder and public forums, and will complete the plan this coming March.

Second, the Mayor announced the City's new policy of being carbon neutral by 2050. The plan will lay out the blueprint to take us there.

Finally, we are advancing a number "low hanging fruit" actions towards carbon neutrality. For example, with a MassDOT CMAQ grant, we have implemented ValleyBike, an electric-assist bike share program to reduce GHG emissions from travel. We are also in the feasibility stage of Community Choice Aggregation PLUS, the plus being how can we make our energy supply more renewable by methods other than buying RECs, from local distributed energy production and storage to reducing our peak demand.

<u>Climate Adaption</u>

As with climate mitigation, our *Resiliency and Regeneration Plan* will advance climate adaptation. We use the word resiliency to signal a systematic approach to thrive with climate change, not simply adopt.

Second, using MVP Action grant funding (thank you), our *Northampton Designs with Nature* program will design stormwater demonstration projects that will help us adapt to climate change and celebrate, instead of fear, water.
