NOTICE OF MEETING

It is anticipated that the following will be discussed at the aforementioned meeting:

2. 30 Penniman Road – Boston, MA

Seeking a variance for all applicable codes listed in order to apply for an installation permit for a Slide Lift.

3. 4 Brattle Street – Cambridge, MA

Seeking relief from ANSI code 2.7.4.1 – Elevator machine room clear headroom, in a partial manner. Removing and replacing an elevator in an older building and re-using existing machine room space from existing elevator (# 49-P-104). Existing elevator is basement drum geared. New elevator will be Canton roped hydro. Machine room is partially under a staircase. The far end of the power unit will be under the stairs and at a height of 74" and code requires 84". Caution signage to be installed.
