DESCRIPTION OF CHANGES: The following are proposed changes to rates for personal care attendant (PCA) services effective on July 1, 2019.

The proposed rates noted above include the PCA wage and the employer expense component, which includes employer required taxes and workers' compensation insurance. The proposed increase in rates is pursuant to the terms of the collective bargaining agreement negotiated between the Commonwealth of Massachusetts and the PCA union (1199SEIU) and in accordance with 101 CMR 309.00: *Rates for Certain Services for the Personal Care Attendant Program*.

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Effective July 1, 2019, PCAs are able to accrue up to 50 hours of paid earned time in a benefit year at a rate of one hour per 30 hours worked rather than 40 hours of earned sick time in a benefit year at that accrual rate. PCAs can begin using paid earned time 90 days after the first date of work at the PCA services hourly rate. Upon termination of all PCA employment, a PCA's remaining accrued paid earned time will be paid out at the PCA rate.

The estimated annual aggregate state expenditures as a result of the above changes to PCA rates effective July 1, 2019, is \$28,866,347.
