## NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARINGS: CONTINUATION OF THE STATE-WATERS RIVER HERRING HARVEST MORATORIUM

Under the provisions of M.G.L. Ch 30A and pursuant to the authority found in M.G.L. Ch. 130 ss. 17A & 80, the Division of Marine Fisheries (*MarineFisheries*) and the Marine Fisheries Advisory Commission (MFC) have scheduled two public hearings to accept comments on proposed changes to 322 CMR 6.17. To continue the ongoing conservation efforts and comply with the interstate management plan for river herring and shad, the Division of Marine Fisheries is proposing the following actions:

- 1. Continue indefinitely the moratorium on the harvest of river herring species in state waters;
- 2. Clarify that a tolerance of river herring species within any batch or container of bait, is allowed, provided it is not more than 5% by count and said bait fish was caught outside of the jurisdiction of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts.
