Notice is hereby given pursuant to M.G.L. c. 30A, §2, that the Executive Office of Labor and Workforce Development, in conjunction with the Department of Labor Standards (DLS), will hold a public hearing regarding the prevailing wage rate classification for work regarding:

- Patching block walls
- Rubbing block walls
- Cutting joints
- Rubbing and cleaning of bricks

The purpose of the informal public hearing will be to receive public comment to determine the most appropriate classification under which DLS should set the rate for the work under review.
