## **KEY ACCOMPLISHMENTS**

The Office would like to share with you a few items that have been reviewed, including:

- ✓ **Social Distancing:** The standard for "social distancing" has been changed from six feet to three feet. This change allows more people to attend essential programming and classes. This is hopefully the first step to returning to "normal" crowd capacity in the months to come.
- ✓ **DOC Corrections facilities emerge from Omicron surge:** The Office is happy to note that all of the DOC facilities have resolved the COVID-19 cases from the last variant, Omicron. We look forward to (and hope for) a stable number of COVID-19 cases this spring.
- ✓ Mask Compliance: DOC staff and officers have done an excellent job with mask compliance and have served as positive role models and examples for the inmates and the community. Thank you.
- ✓ **Communication:** The Office is working on this every day! We now have the website, email, and phone number. We would love to hear from DOC staff regarding concerns and questions about COVID-19 and the post-pandemic world.
- ✓ **Cleaning:** Lighthouse EIP will begin a comprehensive cleaning program for all 15 facilities. The process will take up to twelve weeks and Lighthouse EIP work with DOC staff and inmates onsite to educate them and conduct a terminal cleaning at all DOC facilities. They will also be doing air quality testing.
