

### One Care Voluntary Disenrollment By Rating Category 2018-2021



Voluntary disenrollment rates are highest in F1 and lowest in C2 and C3.



### One Care Voluntary Disenrollment By Rating Category 2018-2021



Most voluntary disenrollments come from C3 and C2 despite their lower disenrollment rates, because of their larger enrollment share.





# One Care Voluntary Disenrollment By Length of Enrollment 2018-2021



The voluntary disenrollment rate is much higher in the first six months than after six months of enrollment.





# One Care Voluntary Disenrollment By Length of Enrollment 2018-2021



■ The volume of overall voluntary disenrollments comes about evenly from these two groups, due to the much larger number of long-term enrollees.

#### One Care Voluntary Disenrollment By County 2018-2021



Voluntary disensellment rates vary widely across year and county, from 2% to 57%.



#### One Care Voluntary Disenrollment By County 2018-2021



Average voluntary disenrollment rates are highest in Berkshire,
 Bristol, and Barnstable. These are all low enrollment counties, and have all been added to One Care through service area expansions.

% of Each County's Average Members that Voluntarily Disenrolled 2018-2021 Average





The high average voluntary disenrollment counties have a very low share of statewide enrollment.



#### One Care Voluntary Disenrollment By County 2018-2021



Share of overall statewide voluntary disenrollment is spread more evenly across the state than the rates of voluntary disenrollment by county.

#### **APPENDIX**

#### **One Care Rating Category Definitions**



- F1 Facility-based Care
   Individuals identified as having a long-term facility stay of more than 90 days
- C3 Community Tier 3 High LTSS Community Need Individuals who have a daily skilled need; two or more Activities of Daily Living (ADL) limitations AND three days of skilled nursing need; and individuals with 4 or more ADL limitations - In CY2014, C3 split into two subsets: C3B: for C3 individuals with certain diagnoses (e.g., quadriplegia, ALS, Muscular Dystrophy and Respirator dependence) leading to costs considerably above the average for current C3 C3A: for remaining C3 individuals
- C2 Community Tier 2 Community High Behavioral Health
   Individuals who have a chronic and ongoing Behavioral Health diagnosis that indicates a
   high level of service need In CY2014, C2 split into two subsets C2B: for C2 individuals
   with co-occurring diagnoses of substance abuse and serious mental illness C2A: for
   remaining C2 individuals
- C1 Community Tier 1 Community Other Individuals in the community who do not meet F1, C2 or C3 criteria
