1	PROCEEDINGS
2	
3	JOHN ROMANO: Good morning, everyone.
4	My name is John Romano. I am the Director of Outdoor
5	Advertising for MassDOT. We are here today for the
6	October 10, 2019 public hearing for the Office of
7	Outdoor Advertising.
8	This meeting is accessible to people
9	with disabilities and individuals with limited English
10	proficiency. If you filed a request with us for
11	assistive technology, sign language, alternate format
12	documents, an interpreter, translated documents, or
13	other such services to be available here today, please
14	see Lydia if you have not yet received the assistance
15	you need. We could also have amplification devices
16	available from Lydia for anyone who may need them. If
17	you need any other similar assistance to participate
18	today, please let Lydia know and she will try to help
19	you.
20	The first item on the agenda is the
21	call to order. On our little table over here, there
22	is a sign-in sheet. If you didn't have a chance to
23	sign in on your way in, you could do so on your way
24	out. That sign-in sheet will be made part of the

1	transcript for the meeting.
2	There is also a copy of the meeting
3	notes from the September $12^{\rm th}$ meeting and a copy of
4	today's agenda.
5	Does anybody have any comments,
6	questions, or concerns on the meeting minutes from
7	September 12, 2019?
8	(No response.)
9	JOHN ROMANO: Seeing none, we will mark
10	those approved.
11	The next item on the agenda is HUB
12	Advertising, LLC, 74-A Clarendon Street, Boston, MA.
13	It's an application for a new license.
14	Is anybody here from HUB Advertising?
15	(No response.)
16	JOHN ROMANO: They said they probably
17	wouldn't be here. It's Mr. Keith Beardsley. We have
18	they have submitted all the appropriate paperwork.
19	We have the Certificate of Good Standing and Tax
20	Compliance. We have the W-9. We did get the
21	appropriate fee. And we do not have see any issues
22	that have been presented at this time. It looks like
23	everything has been in order. Mr. Beardsley is not
24	here to add anything to his application.

1	Does anybody have any comments,
2	questions, or concerns regarding this license
3	application?
4	(No response.)
5	JOHN ROMANO: Okay. Seeing none, we
6	will take that under advisement and get back to HUB
7	Advertising.
8	Before we go any further, just a note I
9	had wanted to read at the beginning here but I forgot.
10	I just want to remind everybody that permit renewals
11	and license renewals are in the process of being
12	mailed out. I think we started earlier this week,
13	right, Lydia, sending them out to people? All
14	renewals are technically due by the end of November
15	2019, so we appreciate that you address those as soon
16	as you get them in the mail and start to get them back
17	to us. And then we will start to process them as we
18	receive them. So, thank you.
19	If you do not get something in the mail
20	from us in the next couple of weeks, you should get in
21	touch with us. But you should get them all.
22	Okay. Next on the agenda is an
23	application for a permit amendment. This is BMC Sign
24	Company, 300 Harrison Ave, Permit Number 2016D017 and

1	D018.
2	So, what we have here is a request to
3	do two things with these two this is an existing
4	monopole sign at 300 Harrison Ave. And the request of
5	this amendment is to do two things: one, change the
6	size of the sign; and the other is to move it to a
7	different location on the property.
8	So, is anybody here from BMC Sign
9	Company? Please state your name for the record.
10	TED TYE: Ted Tye, National
11	Development, BMC Sign Company.
12	STENOGRAPHER: Spell your last name.
13	TED TYE: I'm sorry. T-y-e.
14	JOHN ROMANO: How are you doing, Ted?
15	TED TYE: Nice to see you, John.
16	JOHN ROMANO: Same here.
17	Is anybody here representing the
18	municipality?
19	(No response.)
20	JOHN ROMANO: Any abutters present
21	today?
22	(No response.)
23	JOHN ROMANO: No. Is there anyone here
24	from the MassDOT District Office?

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1	(No response.)
2	JOHN ROMANO: Anyone present from
3	MassDOT Traffic Ops?
4	(No response.)
5	JOHN ROMANO: This sign is a digital
6	sign. It was previously reviewed by our Traffic
7	Operations when it was initially put in. No traffic
8	study was required at the time. We did not request
9	them to look into whether another study was needed
10	because it's only being moved a short distance from
11	its original location. So, while they did get a copy
12	of the amendment, we didn't ask them. There was no
13	reason for them to look into another study.
14	An abutter notification is not required
15	for an amendment.
16	And, Mr. Tye, is it correct that you
17	did receive a special permit from the City of Boston
18	for this change?
19	TED TYE: It was actually a variance
20	from the
21	JOHN ROMANO: A variance.
22	TED TYE: Board of Appeal.
23	JOHN ROMANO: And you did submit a
24	copy of that. I have that in the package.

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1	TED TYE: I did.
2	JOHN ROMANO: And, believe it or not, I
3	actually did read it and I should have known it was a
4	variance. So, thank you for that.
5	So, I'm going to have my inspector give
6	his report, inspection report, on this. So, Mr.
7	Chaves, could you give your report?
8	CHRISTOPHER CHAVES: Yes, sir. Thank
9	you, John.
10	As you mentioned, this is an existing
11	two-sided digital monopole to be moved 87 feet to the
12	northeast corner of the property, the same property.
13	Moving the monopole doesn't change anything from a
14	field standpoint as far as businesses or measurements
15	to any critical areas.
16	The one thing that I will say, since
17	they are close to their property line, is that no part
18	of the sign can overhang their property line.
19	Other than that, it looks good.
20	JOHN ROMANO: So, right now, it's like
21	roughly about right here. Right? It's coming to over
22	here. The wall is the property line.
23	Based on our conversations, the drawing
24	you submitted, you have no intention of it going over

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1	the property line. We just wanted to call that out
2	and have it for the record. But that's a mutual
3	understanding that that's how it will be.
4	TED TYE: Yes.
5	JOHN ROMANO: Chris, any other issues?
6	Actually, both you and I did go out and do the
7	inspection together. Once and a while I like to get
8	out of the office. And this is a good location,
9	actually, a favorite spot of mine because I helped do
10	a lot of work underneath the expressway over there.
11	But, no other issues?
12	CHRISTOPHER CHAVES: No issues, no.
13	JOHN ROMANO: Okay. Mr. Tye, anything
14	you'd like to add to your application at this time?
15	TED TYE: No.
16	JOHN ROMANO: Okay. Great.
17	Does anybody have any questions,
18	concerns, or concerns on this application?
19	(No response.)
20	JOHN ROMANO: Okay. Seeing none, we
21	will take this under advisement and we'll get back to
22	you.
23	Thank you very much.

TED TYE: Thank you very much.

1	JOHN ROMANO: Okay. Next, we have an
2	application for a permit transfer. This is transfer
3	from Boston Outdoor Ventures, LLC to Outfront Media,
4	LLC. It's Permit Number 2007022 and 2007023, 313-315
5	Willard Street in Quincy, Massachusetts.
6	Are either party here with us today?
7	Can you just state your name for the
8	record?
9	ANGELA RUFO: Angela Rufo for Outfront
10	Media.
11	JOHN ROMANO: Angela, we reviewed all
12	of the paperwork. Everything appears to be in order.
13	This is a simple transfer between two approved
14	licensees here at MassDOT. The paperwork was
15	submitted appropriately. The application filled out.
16	The appropriate fee was submitted.
17	I would ask my inspector to just give a
18	quick report because we do check, do a field
19	inspection on these even though they're transfers.
20	CHRISTOPHER CHAVES: As you mentioned,
21	it's a transfer from one licensee to another, although
22	I believe this licensee has ran the sign for quite
23	some time anyway. But it is a conforming monopole,
24	static. No issues with this.

1	JOHN ROMANO: Great. Do you have
2	anything you'd like to add, Angela, to the
3	application?
4	ANGELA RUFO: Nothing.
5	JOHN ROMANO: Great. This is a simple
6	transfer. We will take it under advisement and get
7	back to you.
8	Thank you.
9	Next on the agenda, we have an
10	application for a permit. This is for a static
11	monopole. This is Carroll Advertising, LLC. This is
12	1180 General Edwards Highway in Sharon, Application
13	2019070 and 071.
14	Notification was provided to the
15	municipality by my office on June 11, 2019, to the
16	Town Administrator and to the Town Clerk.
17	Is the applicant present?
18	JOHN CARROLL: Yes, John Carroll from
19	Carroll Advertising.
20	JOHN ROMANO: Is anyone here
21	representing the municipality where the sign is
22	proposed?
23	(No response.)
24	JOHN ROMANO: No. Are any abutters

1	present today?
2	(No response.)
3	JOHN ROMANO: None. Is anyone present
4	from the District Office from MassDOT?
5	(No response.)
6	JOHN ROMANO: No. So, Mr. Carroll,
7	Bill Travers from our Operations in District 5 just
8	wants you to be aware that should any tree trimming be
9	required for this sign, those are reviewed under a
10	separate permit through the District Office. You
11	should contact the District Office and Mr. Travers
12	separately. And you should review anything with him.
13	And that is solely determined by the District as to
14	whether something like that is granted. So, contact
15	him. You can walk the site with him and they'll
16	determine whether the permit is issued. So, that's
17	independent of this office. Okay?
18	JOHN CARROLL: Okay.
19	JOHN ROMANO: Traffic is not required,
20	Traffic Ops, as this is a static permit.
21	Mr. Carroll, was certified mail notice
22	to property owners sent out by you at least 30 days
23	prior to submitting your application to my office?
24	JOHN CARROLL: Yes, sir.

1	JOHN ROMANO: And you have submitted
2	the post office receipts with your application, and I
3	do have those. And you also provided a copy of the
4	letter that you sent out to me as well, correct?
5	JOHN CARROLL: Mm hum.
6	JOHN ROMANO: Have you received any
7	comments in support or opposition of the sign?
8	JOHN CARROLL: No.
9	JOHN ROMANO: And, according to your
10	application signed off by the Town, the Town provided
11	you a special permit, is that correct?
12	JOHN CARROLL: Yes, sir.
13	JOHN ROMANO: And we do have a copy
14	that was submitted with your application, right?
15	JOHN CARROLL: Yes.
16	JOHN ROMANO: Okay. At this time, I'm
17	going to have my field inspector give his report on
18	this application.
19	MARC PLANTE: Thank you, John.
20	This is a static application, two
21	sides, one facing north, one facing south, on Route 1
22	in Sharon, the Town of Sharon. There are two
23	businesses within 500 feet of the location. There are
24	no parks, playground, recreational areas within 300

1	feet.
2	Spacing issues: There is a static sign
3	to the south, which falls under the 500-foot rule.
4	There is also a digital sign to the north on Route 95,
5	which is visible from this location, so it falls under
6	the 500-foot rule again.
7	I have provided from the applicant,
8	from Legacy Engineering, a professionally stamped
9	measurement. To the south, it's 502.4 feet; to the
10	north, it's 509.4 feet. Because of the close
11	proximity to the 500-foot rule, I would emphasize that
12	any extensions such as catwalks, lights, do not
13	compromise the 500-foot rule, which is assessed on
14	this Legacy Engineering diagram. So, it is adhering
15	to all rules.
16	JOHN ROMANO: So, Mr. Carroll, based on
17	the drawing submitted and the site walks done with
18	your engineer and our inspectors, built the way it's
19	shown on that plan, you will be in compliance. What
20	Marc is trying to say, there's no wiggle room, right?
21	JOHN CARROLL: No wiggle room.
22	JOHN ROMANO: It's going to go right
23	where it is, including lights, extensions, catwalks,
24	as shown on your drawing, all fall within that layout.

1	JOHN CARROLL: Yes, sir.
2	JOHN ROMANO: There's no play on either
3	side. So, if it's built as is, as shown, the way it's
4	planned, we have no problems. Understood?
5	JOHN CARROLL: Understood.
6	JOHN ROMANO: Great. Fine. No other
7	issues, right, Marc?
8	MARC PLANTE: No other issues.
9	JOHN ROMANO: Okay. Great. It's also
10	a sign I happened to go out and a location I went
11	out and visited. We were very busy a couple of days
12	last month. But, everything else seems to be in
13	order, right, Marc?
14	MARC PLANTE: Yes.
15	JOHN ROMANO: Great. Okay.
16	Mr. Carroll, anything you'd like to add
17	to your application at this time?
18	JOHN CARROLL: No.
19	JOHN ROMANO: Okay. Any comments,
20	questions, concerns from the audience, general public?
21	(No response.)
22	JOHN ROMANO: Okay. Seeing none, we
23	will take this under advisement and we'll get back to
24	you.

1	JOHN CARROLL: Thank you.
2	JOHN ROMANO: Thank you.
3	Okay. The next item on the agenda is
4	for the record, actions taken since the last public
5	hearing. Does anybody have any questions or comments
6	on that, those items?
7	(No response.)
8	JOHN ROMANO: Okay. None.
9	Last, public comment?
10	(No response.)
11	JOHN ROMANO: Seeing none. Okay. We
12	are adjourned. Thank you all very much. Enjoy the
13	rest of the day.
