PROCEEDINGS 1 2 3 JOHN ROMANO: Good morning, everybody. I'm the Director of Outdoor 4 My name is John Romano. 5 Advertising for MassDOT. We are here for the October 8, 2020 Office of Outdoor Advertising hearing. 6 7 This meeting is being held virtually by Governor's Executive Order. Due to the COVID-19 8 9 pandemic, we cannot meet in person, so we are doing 10 this virtually. 11 We are running this hearing by 12 GoToWebinar. 13 Please note that this meeting is being 14 recorded by a stenographer who is in attendance. He 15 will provide a transcript of the meeting as always, 16 and it will be posted to our web page once the meeting 17 notes are approved 18 This meeting is accessible for people with disabilities and individuals with limited 19 20 proficiency. If you filed a request for assistance 21 and did not receive it, please contact MassDOT's 22 Office of Diversity and Civil Rights at 857-368-8580 23 or massdot.civilrights@dot.state.ma.us. And, to the 24 best of my knowledge, we did not receive any requests

1 ahead of time.

Please note that the accessible 2 3 versions of the meeting materials have previously been posted to the OOA website and will be referred to in 4 5 the meeting. The materials are also available for download through GoToWebinar. They are in the handout 6 7 section. We are going to run this meeting as 8 9 close to normal as our regular Outdoor Advertising 10 hearings. I will go through the agenda. While the 11 sign-in sheet cannot be physically signed, we will 12 have a list of those who signed up for the webinar and 13 we will use that as our sign-in sheet. 14 On the screen is the agenda. What we 15 will do is I will go through each item. I will ask 16 the questions of the proponents, just like I do in the 17 hearing at the office in person at 10 Park Plaza. 18 Just so you know, everybody in the public is currently muted. In about two minutes, the 19 20 organizer is going to unmute everyone and you should 21 mute yourself at that time. Should the organizer, who 22 is Gerry Kelleher from MassDOT, hear excessive 23 background noise, he will mute people individually or 24 the whole group if needed.

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If you would like to speak during --1 2 when public comment is requested, you can unmute 3 yourself at that time. If you have any trouble unmuting yourself to make a comment, you can use the 4 5 raise your hand function in GoToWebinar in order to indicate you would like to make a comment. 6 To raise 7 your hand in GoToWebinar, click the hand icon in the 8 control panel. If you are connected by phone to the 9 audio, you can press \*9 to raise your hand. On the phone, you can also press \*1 to play the features menu 10 11 and \*2 to mute or unmute audio. 12 You can also post your comments or 13 questions in the chat box. You will have a chance to 14 make comments just like you do in the regular public 15 hearing at the end of each item and then a final chance for overall comments at the end of the agenda. 16 17 For anybody who may be new to this hearing, we do not make any decisions at this actual 18 hearing. Every item is taken under advisement and 19 20 decisions are made usually within a few weeks, 21 sometimes as early as a week, but we will give time for write-in comments to our email address, which is 22 23 OOAInformation@dot.state.ma.us. You can send comments 24 in writing there as well.

1 With that, Gerry, if you can unmute 2 everybody, we will start. GERARD KELLEHER: 3 Okay. STENOGRAPHER: I believe you muted 4 5 everybody. 6 JOHN ROMANO: Can you hear me? 7 GERARD KELLEHER: Everyone should be 8 unmuted now. 9 JOHN ROMANO: All right. Can you hear 10 me? All right. Sorry. So, I'll go back. 11 We're going to go over the meeting minute approval for July 9, 2020 because that's the 12 last meeting that we had. Okay? 13 14 So, Gerry, can you put those meeting 15 minutes up on the screen, please? 16 GERARD KELLEHER: Okay. 17 JOHN ROMANO: Okay. Does anybody have 18 any comments or questions regarding the July 9th regular session minutes, which was the last public 19 20 meeting that we had? We did not have a meeting in 21 August or September. 22 (No response.) 23 JOHN ROMANO: Okay. I don't hear any 24 questions.

1 And, Gerry, Lydia, no comments in the I don't see any. So, with that, we will mark 2 chat. 3 those approved. 4 GERARD KELLEHER: Okay. 5 JOHN ROMANO: Today is October 8, 2020. 6 Okay. 7 So, the next item on the agenda is 8 applications for permits. 9 Gerry, if you could put the agenda back 10 up for a minute. 11 And we will go to Carroll Advertising, 12 This is an application, 1200 General Edwards LLC. Highway. This is for a two-sided structure, one side 13 14 static facing north, and one side digital facing 15 south. This is in Sharon, Massachusetts. The permit 16 numbers are 2020007 facing north, 2020D009 facing 17 south, which is the digital. 18 Notification was provided to the 19 municipality, to the town administrator and clerk, by 20 my office, on August 18, 2020. 21 Is the applicant present? And, if so, 22 please state your name and your company. 23 (No response.) JOHN ROMANO: Mr. Carroll, are you in 24

1 attendance? JOHN CARROLL: I am, John. I just -- I 2 3 just popped with -- the unmute button popped up for So, I was able to hear you guys, but I don't 4 me. 5 think you heard me until the unmute went on. 6 JOHN ROMANO: Okay. 7 JOHN CARROLL: Can you hear me now? 8 JOHN ROMANO: Yes, we can. 9 State your name and company. 10 JOHN CARROLL: John Carroll, Carroll 11 Advertising. 12 JOHN ROMANO: Okay. Great. Thank you. 13 And is anybody here representing the 14 municipality where the sign is being proposed? 15 (No response.) JOHN ROMANO: Okay. I don't hear 16 17 anyone, so I'm going to put "no." 18 Are there any abutters present today? 19 (No response.) 20 JOHN ROMANO: Okay. Seeing none -21 hearing none, I should say. 22 Is anybody present from the MassDOT 23 District Highway Office? 24 (No response.)

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1 JOHN ROMANO: We did receive an email from Bill Travers from District 5 in which this board 2 And the District has no comments or 3 is located. And that's in an email sent to my office. objections. 4 5 Is anyone present from MassDOT Traffic Operations? 6 7 (No response.) 8 JOHN ROMANO: Okay. I do not hear or 9 see anybody, but I did receive a memo from the state 10 Traffic Engineer's Office regarding this application 11 seeing that one board is a digital application. And 12 the memo states that no traffic study, further traffic 13 study, is required for this location. Okay. Mr. Carroll, these questions are 14 15 for you, so if you could respond to these. 16 So, was certified mail notice to 17 abutters sent out by you at least 30 days prior to submitting your application to my office? 18 19 JOHN CARROLL: There was an approval 20 prior that where I think we were able to get -- the 21 Town said that there was no new hearing required on 22 their end because it was an existing board; it's being 23 rebuilt on the exact same site. 24 JOHN ROMANO: John, I'm asking about

1 the abutter note. Did you send the abutter notice out 2 30 days prior to submitting your application to me? 3 JOHN CARROLL: Yes. JOHN ROMANO: Thank you. And I have a 4 5 -- and I do have a copy of that letter, and I have your post office receipts. So, thank you for 6 7 submitting them. 8 Have you received any written comments 9 in support or opposition to this board? 10 JOHN CARROLL: No, sir. 11 JOHN ROMANO: Neither has my office. 12 And I believe you've already -- the 13 next question you answered to my previous question. 14 There is a special permit from the Town, but it is a 15 previous permit that was given so a new hearing wasn't 16 required. But the Town did sign off on your 17 application. They did reference the special permit that was issued. And you did provide that to me. 18 Is 19 that your understanding? 20 JOHN CARROLL: Yes, sir. 21 JOHN ROMANO: Mr. Carroll, we'll have 22 Marc, the inspector, give his field report on this. 23 And my other inspector, Mr. Bean, is going to share 24 his screen and show a Google Earth photo of where this

1 location is. So, if you could give us a second. Marc, wait till Jason gets his screen 2 We'll see if we can make this work. 3 up there. 4 MARC PLANTE: Yes, sir. 5 JOHN ROMANO: Gerry, want to take the agenda down for now? That might help. 6 7 GERARD KELLEHER: Yeah. Have you got 8 it, Jason, now, the presenter? 9 JOHN ROMANO: There you go. All right. 10 So, the location with - you can pinpoint that. Oh, 11 you had it, Jason. There you go. Where the yellow 12 pushpin is, that's the -- that's the spot on the 13 property where the board will be located. 14 So, Marc, if you could give your 15 inspector's report, I'd appreciate it. MARC PLANTE: Yes, sir. Thank you. 16 17 This is an application for a monopole. 18 One side is to be digital; the other side is to be static. It is located on U.S. Route 1 in the Town of 19 20 Sharon, which General Edwards Highway, 1200, is the 21 actual address. 22 The area is of business character, and 23 there are two businesses within 500 feet of the 24 proposed sign.

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1 There are no parks, reservations, or playgrounds within 300 feet of the site. And there is 2 3 spacing between two static signs, one to the north, one to the south. They both exceed the 500-foot rule. 4 5 So, the site is conforming to the regulations. 6 7 JOHN ROMANO: Marc, thank you. Could you just give a little description? So, the board is 8 9 on the lower end of the parcel. Is that the south end 10 of the parcel? Which side -- the digital side is 11 facing which way, and the north side -- and the static 12 side is facing which way, just so --13 MARC PLANTE: On the applications, the 14 digital is marked facing south on the application. 15 JOHN ROMANO: All right. MARC PLANTE: The static -- the static 16 17 is marked facing north on the application. 18 JOHN ROMANO: Okay. It's actually the other 19 JOHN CARROLL: 20 way around. 21 MARC PLANTE: Yes, it is. But it's 22 marked on your application, and you marked it. The 23 digital has a south-facing check on it, and the static 24 has a north-facing check.

1 JOHN ROMANO: Okay. MARC PLANTE: On your application. 2 3 JOHN CARROLL: I think there was some confusion with the submission of that. I think we 4 5 kind of checked the wrong boxes and then there was some confusion. But I know that when we did the site 6 7 visit there, it was the digital face was on the side 8 because the spacing was so close and it was up to the 9 camera. And that was on the -- that was on the north 10 face. So, the digital is on the north -- that's 11 right. That's right, Marc. The south face is the 12 traffic heading south, is that correct? 13 MARC PLANTE: Oh, I'm just guoting --14 I'm quoting what you have in the application. That's 15 all. 16 JOHN CARROLL: Yeah. MARC PLANTE: But if it was the --17 18 JOHN ROMANO: I remember we fixed the application and Marc has it -- we have it right. 19 Ιf 20 you remember, because I have -- I have your original 21 application in front of me. And you originally had it 22 switched and then you had to come in and change it, if 23 you remember, and initial the change. 2.4 JOHN CARROLL: I do remember. T do

1 remember.

JOHN ROMANO: So, the digital 2 3 application 2020D009, the sign faces south, and the static sign faces north. 4 5 JOHN CARROLL: But it's the other way around, John. 6 7 MARC PLANTE: Actually, he wants to do it digital facing north, static facing south. His --8 JOHN CARROLL: Which was -- that was 9 10 what it was originally permitted for, too. 11 MARC PLANTE: And the 500-foot spacing 12 situation applies. If you switch it also, it also applies. It exceeds the 500-foot spacing. So, it 13 would be allowable. 14 15 JOHN ROMANO: Okay. So, we'll clarify before any final decision is made. We'll make sure 16 17 we've got the right boxes checked on the application. But, Marc, your inspection in the field 18 matches and is correct, and the spacing and all of the 19 20 items related to the CMR are correct, is that --21 MARC PLANTE: Yes. Yes, they are. 22 JOHN ROMANO: Okay. Okay. We'll make 23 sure that we've got the right box checked on the application -- well, that you have the right box 24

1 checked on the application. We'll rectify that before any final decision is made. 2 3 JOHN CARROLL: Okay. Thank you. Sorry for the confusion. 4 JOHN ROMANO: Okay. So, you probably 5 had the original thing checked correctly, and then we, 6 7 for whatever reason, changed it. So, we'll doublecheck that and get the right boxes checked. 8 9 Okay. At that point -- at this point, 10 do you have anything else you'd like to add to your 11 application at this time? 12 JOHN CARROLL: No, sir, other than I appreciate all the help that the guys were for this 13 14 application. 15 JOHN ROMANO: Okay. At this time, I'd 16 like to open it up. Does anybody in attendance have 17 any comments or questions on this sign or application 18 or location? 19 (No response.) 20 JOHN ROMANO: Okay. I am not seeing 21 anything in the chat, and I am not seeing any hand 2.2 raised. 23 Gerry or Lydia, do you see any? LYDIA QUICK: No. I haven't gotten any 24

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1 emails either.

JOHN ROMANO: We will to take this 2 under advisement, Mr. Carroll. We will re-review the 3 directions facing, which, as Mr. Plante said, the 4 5 spacing requirement, which we know is, you know, 6 critical here, works in either direction. So, we'll 7 just make sure we've got the paperwork matching the way the signs will be facing so that there are no 8 9 issues with that before any approval is decided upon 10 on this location. 11 It is October 8, 2020. 12 Okay. Thank you. 13 Gerry, if you could put the agenda up. 14 Jason, you can unshare your screen, if 15 you don't mind. 16 Put the agenda back up, Gerry. 17 We'll go to Item 4, which is For the 18 Record. GERARD KELLEHER: Can you see that? 19 20 JOHN ROMANO: Yeah. Can you scroll to 21 the second page, "For the Record," please? GERARD KELLEHER: How's that? 22 23 JOHN ROMANO: Yeah. And just scroll 24 through to the next page because it goes right through

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1 to the end. Okay. You can go right through to the Thank you. Hold it right there, Gerry. Thank 2 end. 3 you. Okay. Does anybody have any comments 4 5 or question on any For the Record items? 6 I see Ed Harrington's got his hand 7 raised. Ed, if you want to unmute yourself and ask your question? State your name and your affiliation, 8 9 please. 10 ED HARRINGTON: Ed Harrington. 11 GERARD KELLEHER: Go ahead. 12 JOHN ROMANO: Hi. ED HARRINGTON: Hi. I'm the Town 13 Councilor for District 5 in South Weymouth where the 14 15 Finnell board is proposed. 16 JOHN ROMANO: Yes, sir. 17 ED HARRINGTON: Is this an appropriate 18 time for me to just state my piece here, make my 19 piece? Can I speak to that? 20 JOHN ROMANO: If you give me 30, 21 seconds, I will ask for general comment on anything 22 and you can take it then if that's okay with you. 23 Just hold your mic open for a second. All right? 24 ED HARRINGTON: I'll try.

1 JOHN ROMANO: All right. Just stay 2 here. All right. You know what? You may as well. 3 It's under For the Record. That application is on the For the Record piece. So, go right ahead. 4 5 ED HARRINGTON: All right. Thank you very much. 6 7 As I said, I'm Ed Harrington. I'm the Town Councilor for the area where the Finnell board is 8 9 proposed to be located. 10 There's a large neighborhood group that 11 are of the opinion that they can get themselves on 12 board here and fight against the location of this The billboard is proposed to go at the 13 billboard. 14 very end of a long 45-acre parcel of land owned by the 15 Bristol Company. They are of the opinion that if they beat this, then they can also beat any kind of 16 17 development within that 45-acre parcel of land. And I think they're suffering from a lack of good 18 information. They're uninformed and they're 19 20 disinformed in that if they have some luck here with 21 you folks and they try to -- and they have some 22 success at stopping the location of the billboard, 23 they will then be able to go and fight the development of that 45-acre parcel, which is, in my opinion, and 24

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in the opinion of anybody who has been around, that
 45-acre parcel will be developed.

3 Right now, (inaudible - cutting out) is
4 Bristol won't develop the acreage if the billboard
5 goes up, but he will develop the acreage if it doesn't
6 go up. But these people are of the opinion that they
7 can -- they can do both things.

8 Mr. Bristol has the right to put up 9 buildings that conform or a development that conforms 10 with our zoning on that parcel, and he has the ability 11 to do so. He's been around a long time. There's 12 wetlands in there, but he knows how to do wetlands 13 recreations. And it's just an impossible situation.

14 I just wanted it stated on the record 15 that I personally believe the billboard at the very 16 tip of this thing is far less -- has far less of an 17 impact on the neighborhood than 45 acres of development, which might include light industrial. 18 And Mr. Bristol has also indicated that he might put 19 20 in 350 units of low-income housing. So, these people 21 have been led to believe that they can have it all and 22 that they can prevail in any event on both issue. 23 And I just wanted it on the record that

24 I'm not crazy about billboards anyway, but I'm

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1	certainly not crazy about seeing that 45 acres
2	developed to the max. And I think these people, if it
3	works out that way, they're going to regret it in the
4	long run.
5	I guess that's about all I have to say.
6	Thank you.
7	JOHN ROMANO: Thank you for your
8	comment, Mr. Harrington. We will make sure that that
9	is with the, you know, record of comments received on
10	the O Finnell applications. As you know, no decision
11	has been made on that particular application at this
12	time.
13	ED HARRINGTON: Yeah.
14	JOHN ROMANO: But we appreciate your
15	comment.
16	ED HARRINGTON: Yeah. Sure. Can you
17	still hear me now?
18	JOHN ROMANO: Yes, we can.
19	ED HARRINGTON: I think a lot of these
20	people are angry that they felt they were led astray
21	into at first supporting the billboard relocation.
22	And then they found out later that perhaps I think
23	they feel somewhat used or whatever. So, I think

1	clouding their judgment and their ability to, you
2	know, to hear other points of view.
3	But, that's it. I probably have said
4	too much. Thank you.
5	JOHN ROMANO: No problem. Thank you
6	for your comment.
7	Does anybody else have anything to add
8	on the For the Record?
9	(No response.)
10	JOHN ROMANO: Okay. Seeing none
11	others, the last item is general public comment. Is
12	there any other general public comment on today's
13	agenda or any other OOA items?
14	(No response.)
15	JOHN ROMANO: Okay, hearing or seeing
16	none, no hands raised, nothing in the chat box, with
17	that I will adjourn the meeting. Thank you all very
18	much for attending. I appreciate you bearing with us
19	as we do these meetings virtual. I appreciate all of
20	your attendance and your patience. And we plan on
21	having our next meeting is, I think it's November
22	12. Is that correct, Lydia? And we plan on that
23	going forward as of right now.
24	LYDIA QUICK: It is correct. Sorry.

1	JOHN ROMANO: We'll be doing it
2	virtual, and notice will get out to you as it has,
3	just like this. We'll get the link out to everybody.
4	Thank you all very much. Have a great
5	day. And we will talk to you soon.
6	Meeting adjourned.
