Board Business:

The Board meeting was called to order at 10:03 a.m.

The first matter of business was the review of the open session minutes from the November 5, 2020 meeting. Attorney Healy made a motion to approve the minutes. The motion was seconded by Attorney Bocian. A roll call vote was taken, and the motion carried unanimously (5-0).

EXECUTIVE SESSION

Board Business:

At the end of the open session, Chairperson Dunne indicated the Board would be entering into Executive Session to review firearms petitions whose subject matter is protected pursuant to G.L. c. 30A, § 21(a)(7) and G.L. c. 4, § 7. The Board would not reconvene in open session. Attorney Bocian made a motion to enter executive session for this purpose. Attorney Healy seconded the motion. A
