**DECISION**

**HONEY FARMS, INC.**  
**167 DANIEL SHAYS HIGHWAY**

Honey Farms, Inc. (the "Licensee") holds an alcohol license issued pursuant to M.G.L. c. 138, §15. The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission (the "Commission") held a hearing on Tuesday, June 3, 2014, regarding an alleged violation of 204 CMR 2.05 (2) - Permitting an illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: c. 138, §34 Sale or delivery of an alcoholic beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age. Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the licensee stipulated to the violation alleged in Investigator Doyle's Report.

The following documents are in evidence:

1. Licensee's Stipulation of Facts;
  2. Investigator Doyle's Compliance Check Field Report dated February 12, 2014.
- A. Honey Farms Tips and Training Policies Manual.

There is one (1) audio recording of this hearing.

**FACTS**

1. On Wednesday, February 12, 2014, at approximately 7:06 p.m., Investigators Bailey and Doyle conducted an investigation of the business operation of Honey Farms Inc.
2. An underage operative, working with investigators, purchased an alcoholic beverage, a twenty-five (25 oz.) Budweiser Light beer for two dollars and sixty four cents (\$2.64). The underage operative was not asked for identification.


### CONCLUSION

Based on the evidence, the Commission finds the licensee violated 204 CMR 2.05 (2) - Permitting an illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: c. 138, §34 – Sale or delivery of an alcoholic beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age.

As the licensee has been in business for approximately ten (10) years and with no previous violations, the Commission issues a **WARNING**.
