DECISION

ORANGE SUPERMARKET INC. D/B/A ORANGE GENERAL STORE 217 EAST MAIN ST.

Orange Supermarket Inc. d/b/a Orange General Store (the "Licensee") holds an alcohol license issued pursuant to M.G.L. c. 138, §15. The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission (the "Commission") held a hearing on Tuesday, September 20, 2016, regarding an alleged violation of 204 CMR 2.05 (2) — Permitting an illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: M.G.L. c. 138, §34 — Sale or delivery of an alcoholic beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age. Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the Licensee stipulated to the violation alleged in Investigator Doyle's Report.

The following documents are in evidence:

- 1. Investigator Doyle's Compliance Check Field Report dated March 28, 2016;
- 2. Licensee's Stipulation of Facts;
- 3. ABCC 2016 Compliance Check Guidelines; and
- 4. Photograph of Underage Operative.
- A. Licensee's Receipt for Purchase of Identification Scanner.

There is one (1) audio recording of this hearing.

The Commission took Administrative Notice of the Licensee's record.

FACTS

- 1. On Monday, March 28, 2016, at approximately 6:30 p.m., Investigators Bailey and Doyle ("Investigators") investigated the business operation of Orange Supermarket Inc. d/b/a Orange General Store.
- 2. An underage operative, working with Investigators, purchased from the Licensee an alcoholic beverage, a 16 oz. can of Budweiser Light beer, for one dollar and sixty-four cents (\$1.64). The underage operative was not asked for identification.

CONCLUSION

Based on the evidence the Commission finds the Licensee violated 204 CMR 2.05 (2) - Permitting an illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: M.G.L. c. 138, §34 – Sale or delivery of an alcoholic beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age. Therefore, the Commission suspends the license for three (3) days of which three (3) days will be held in abeyance for a period of two (2) years provided no further violations of Chapter 138 or Commission Regulations occur.
