Operating principals

- Access to the outdoors for the public is an essential service, especially during the summer. Goal of reopen plan for outdoors and recreation is to allow as much access as possible, in a safe way, with many opportunities for low risk activities.
- DPH guidelines regarding social distancing, gathering size, masks and cleaning protocols to be implemented as relevant across each activity
- Many of outdoors activities are also a major economic driver for communities throughout Massachusetts. Timing matters because many activities are seasonal
- Outdoor recreation guidance will apply to municipal, non-profit and business venues
- Strong coordination with childcare, retail, venue decisions

Beaches are Open for Passive and Active Activity

- ❖ Beaches, which have been open to transitory activity can open for passive activities such as swimming and sunbathing provided that certain protocols are followed to continue to ensure safe distancing

Parks are Open with Increasing Amenities and Activities

- ❖ DCR parks are still open for enjoyment and additional low contact recreational opportunities will now be allowed

Adventure Awaits

- ❖ Take advantage of the many seasonal outdoor & adventure recreational opportunities such as mountain biking, white-water rafting, adventure canopy tours and summer recreational opportunities

Go Fish . . . Or Hunt, Or Boat

- ❖ Most fishing, hunting and boating opportunities are open and easy to do safely while socially distancing

Outdoor Education and Nature Parks Open

- ❖ Botanical Gardens, Zoological Parks, Nature Centers, Outdoor Wildlife Reserves, and Outdoor Public Art Installations can open in a limited manner for enjoyment

States looked at: Vermont, Maine, New Hampshire, Rhode Island, Connecticut, and New York, California, New Jersey, Maryland, Delaware, Pennsylvania, Virginia, North Carolina, Illinois, Minnesota

State Parks Statewide:

CT, NY, VT, ME, NH, RI, CA, NJ, MD, DE, PA, VA, NC, IL, MN: some/most open for day use, with restrictions (including parking)

Beaches:

NY, ME, CT, CA, NJ, MD, DE, VA, NC: Some beaches open with restrictions (i.e. parking, transitory activities)

NH, VT, RI, PA, IL, MN: Closed for now

Camping:

NH: planning to open in May with restrictions

VT, RI, ME, NY, CT, CA, NJ, DE, VA, NC, IL, MN: Closed through at least May/June for recreational camping

PA: Private campgrounds opened May 1st, state campgrounds closed until at least May 14th

MD: Opened May 7th

Playgrounds:

NY, RI, CT, VT, NH, CA, NJ, DE, PA, VA, NC, IL: Closed

ME, MD, MN: Open/opening soon (MD/MN: local jurisdictions may choose to keep them closed)

Low-Contact Outdoor Activities:

NH, NY, ME: Golf open

VT, MD, CA: Golf open, began opening some athletic courts (i.e. tennis, handball); CA began offering rentals (i.e. bikes, kayaks)

NJ: Golf open, organized activities closed (i.e., picnics, team sports), some tennis courts open

PA, IL, MN, NC, MD: Golf open, fishing and boating allowed, some tennis courts open
