Why participate?

- Everyone has some environmental chemicals in their body – from the food we eat, air we breathe, and water we drink.
- The Massachusetts Department of Public Health is offering free testing for environmental chemicals in the body.
- We will explain your results and discuss ways to reduce contact with environmental chemicals, if needed.



What will happen?

- We test a small sample of your blood and urine for certain chemicals. This is called biomonitoring.
- You can participate in a one-hour in-person appointment (blood and urine) or have a kit sent to your home (urine only).
- We keep your results and personal information confidential.
