What Is WaterSense?



- Voluntary partnership & labeling program sponsored by U.S. EPA
- Promotes adoption of waterefficient products and services



- Simple way to identify products that use less water and perform well
 - new homes & services too





What's Special About WaterSense?





- Criteria for efficiency & performance
 - Use 20% less water
 - Equivalent or superior performance
- A label with integrity
 - Third-party bodies test & certify products
 - Backed by EPA
- National specifications



Who Can Become a WaterSense Partner?



- Manufacturers design and create products to meet specs
- Certification bodies test and label products

- Submit award application (Optional)






