Subject: **Peer to Peer Technical Assistance and Training Project**

Purpose: To notify Local Workforce Boards, One-Stop Career Center Operators and other local workforce partners that the Department of Labor, Employment and Training Administration (ETA), Region 1 has chosen to recognize Massachusetts as a leader in Workforce Development and has awarded grant funds to develop and launch the Peer to Peer Technical Assistance and Training (TAT) Project.

Background: The Peer to Peer/TAT Project (P2P/TAT) is designed to showcase excellent Massachusetts Workforce Development programs, projects and best practices via a national website where other states can review and request training and technical assistance directly from the Massachusetts Workforce Development system and its partners. Programs such as the MassBiz Works Project; the RESEA Program; the Multicultural Services LEP Program; OJT and Re-entry Projects in Hampden County and various recruitment projects such as those conducted in Fall River (Plainville Casino) and New Bedford (Titleist Co.) are examples of some of the outstanding service delivery practices within Massachusetts workforce system.

The project will offer specific training/technical assistance to other states and may be delivered in a variety of ways including, but not limited to, in-person classroom training; video conferencing; conference calls; videos; materials

(handbooks/manuals), etc. P2P/TAT will provide funds for travel, materials and other program costs.
