We have discussed the DoN Application with the Applicant and are in support of UMass Memorial Health's plans to develop a Proton Therapy Service at the UMass Memorial Medical Center Cancer Center at Marlborough.

The need for investment in advanced cancer care therapies and technologies continues to grow, particularly in Central Massachusetts where population growth and cancer diagnoses are increasing. Proton therapy is a highly effective and proven cancer treatment that improves the precision of radiation in targeting tumors and reduces potential damage to healthy tissue in the body. This significantly reduces the acute/chronic side effects of treatment.

For years across all of New England, proton therapy has been exclusively offered at Massachusetts General Hospital (MGH), which was one of the first providers of proton therapy in the United States. Due to their international reputation and the scarcity of proton therapy centers in New England, the MGH facility is consistently at capacity. Accordingly, MGH has been selective about

accepting patients for proton therapy treatment, focusing on pediatric patients, skull-based tumors, and other limited disease sites where tumor targets abut normal tissue.

Due to persistent full capacity at MGH, distance to travel, insurance barriers, and inherent process-driven delays in starting therapy, proton treatment has been less available to our patients in Central Massachusetts who require daily treatment. Currently, those patients who can access treatment are faced with the added burden of traveling many miles from home. The inability to refer patients locally for timely care can result in adverse health effects and outcomes.

With new miniaturized, cost-effective proton technology, UMass Memorial Health aims to reduce the burden of accessing state-of-the-art cancer care for individuals and their families by offering proton therapy in Marlborough. Developing a proton therapy service in Marlborough will improve patient outcomes and wellbeing, as well as address the existing financial and geographic disparity between patients who can access proton therapy in Boston and those who cannot.
