#### **Discussion**

#### 1. Code updates

• 1 ½" tub/shower drain amendments

Member Kaldas proposed to change the code to require all tub drains to 2 inch, which would ensure that if they were later converted to showers, the pipe size would be adequate.

Vote: BK motion to change tub drain to 2" and seconded by JC

Roll call

NO votes from JM, HK, WT, SB Abstain votes from RA, DK YES votes from JW, BK, JC Result: Motion does not pass 4-3

Legal counsel noted that no other topics had been requested by members, thus suggested that the time would be appropriate to approve the draft code to go through the formal promulgation process including a public hearing.

Special Permission Plumbing Application Update

Staff presented an amendment to the special permission application, primarily addressing rainwater systems. This was not considered controversial. No discussion took place.

Vote: A motion was made to accept the new application by WT, seconded by HK.

# **VARIANCES**

## REVISIT from JULY 2021 - PV-370 New England Bar Pizza Co. LLC - CRISP - 1049 Main Street - Walpole

The initial summary and Motion: The petitioner (Robert Carnes III) is seeking a variance from 248 CMR The existing building has two bathrooms with toilets and sinks. Due to COVID they have been forced in the past year to create outdoor space for dining. During this time the business has grown. The petitioner is looking to seat somewhere near (but no more than) 150 people. The applicant indicates that the current footprint does not allow for adding permanent bathrooms and that the financial hardship to tear down existing walls and add more bathrooms would be too overwhelming for the business. The local Board of Health has been notified.

Vote: WT made a motion to Allow 76 occupants including employees. Seats wherever indoor and out. Seconded by JC

**Result: Unanimous approval** 

#### 22-PV-584 - CHARLES M. MORAN PLUMBING & HEATING - 5 GOYA DRIVE, WEBSTER

Tabled from the August meeting. The Petitioner is seeking from 248 CMR 10.10 (i) 2, distance to a toilet facility. The petitioner is requesting to locate a bathroom group at the corner of the,13,000 square foot, building to keep it out of the flow of the automated fork truck traffic. Providing safety but placing the bathroom 360' to the furthest distance away. The applicant has indicated the local board of health and plumbing inspector have been notified.

Vote: WT made a motion to approve and seconded by HK

**Result: Unanimous approval** 

#### 22-PV-610 – Joseph Igoe, Code Red Consultants – Littleton Drive Wareham

The Petitioner, Joseph Igoe, is requesting relief from 248 CMR 10.10(18) Table 1. The petitioner is requesting to install zero showers in the Fitness Area as the area is primarily used by residents of the complex who will have access to the showers in their individual dwelling units. The applicant has indicated the local board of health and plumbing inspector have been notified.

Vote: WT made a motion to approve and seconded by JW

**Result: Unanimously approved** 

#### 22-PV-629 - A & M Mazzolla LLC - 245 Washington Street - Woburn

The Petitioner, Marco Mazzola, if requesting relief from 248 CMR 10.10 Table 1. The business, a martial arts studio, has been classified as a fitness facility. The martial arts facility will be serving children ages 3-12. The Petitioner seeks to avoid the installation of showers as they believe they will not be used by this age group for a variety of reasons. The applicant has indicated the local board of health and plumbing inspector have been notified.

Vote: WT made a motion to require one unisex shower with a lock on the door and seconded by JW

**Result: Unanimously approved** 

#### 22-PV-630 - One School Global - 59 Dwinnell Road – Milbury

The Petitioner, One School Global, is seeking relief from 248 CMR 10.10 – Drinking Water Station. The Petitioner cites the quality of the well water in the school and is willing to provide bottled water dispensers in each building. The applicant has indicated the local board of health and plumbing inspector have been notified.

Vote: WT made a motion to rough in for water bubblers but do not need to install and seconded by JW

Result: Unanimously approved.

#### 22-PV-636 – Brad Hedstrom / DCR – 1041 Cascade Street - Pittsfield

This is a Post Installation variance application. The Petitioner, Brad Hedstrom of DCR, is seeking a post installation variance from 248 CMR 10.02 Basic Principle 1 (Potable Water), Basic Principle 3 (Hot Water), 10.15 Sanitary Drainage System & 10.16 Vents and Venting for the premanufactured bathroom installed within Pittsfield State Forest Campground. The petitioner states that the sink will have signage stating that the water is "not potable and should not be consumed" and that due to the self-sufficiency of the units there is not enough power to support a hot water tank. The state plumbing inspector has been notified.

Vote: DK made a motion to deny and seconded by WT

Result: Unanimously denied

#### 22-PV-637 - Brad Hedstrom / DCR - 30 Rockwell Road - Lanesborough

This is a Post Installation variance application. The Petitioner, Brad Hedstrom of DCR, is seeking a post installation variance from 248 CMR 10.02 Basic Principle 1 (Potable Water), Basic Principle 3 (Hot Water), 10.15 Sanitary Drainage System & 10.16 Vents and Venting for five premanufactured bathrooms installed within Mount Greylock State Reservation. The petitioner states that the sink will have signage stating that the water is "not potable and should not be consumed" and that due to the self-sufficiency of the units there is not enough power to support a hot water tank. The state plumbing inspector has been notified.

In discussion, members noted that this type of variance would be unprecedented and possibly a health danger.

Vote: DK made a motion to deny and seconded by WT

Result: Unanimously denied

It was noted that 638 to 640 were identical requests to this variance.

Vote: HK made a motion to deny the identical requests and seconded by WT

Result: Unanimous – the denial applies to 638 to 640.

#### 22-PV-638 - Brad Hedstrom / DCR - 720 South Street - Pittsfield

This is a Post Installation variance application. The Petitioner, Brad Hedstrom of DCR, is seeking a post installation variance from 248 CMR 10.02 Basic Principle 1 (Potable Water), Basic Principle 3 (Hot Water), 10.15 Sanitary Drainage System & 10.16 Vents and Venting for the premanufactured bathroom installed within Federated Women's Club Forest. The petitioner states that the sink will have signage stating that the water is "not potable and should not be consumed" and that due to the self-sufficiency of the units there is not enough power to support a hot water tank. The state plumbing inspector has been notified.

#### 22-PV-641 - Derby Square Architects - 614 Washington Street - Canton

The Petitioner, Bill Peterson of Derby Square Architects, is seeking a variance from 248 CMR 10.10 Table 1. The existing restaurant has one male and one female toilet. Expanding for additional capacity would require and additional toilet. The petitioner is seeking permission occupancy ii i The applicant has indicated the local board of health and plumbing inspector have been notified.

Vote: DK made a motion to limit occupancy to 75 total including employees which would be 65 seats and 10 employees. Seconded by WT

Result: Unanimously approve with above conditions

#### 22-GV-643 - Michael Marcoux - 23 Carter Lane - Andover

The Petitioner, Michael Marcoux, is seeking a variance for a handmade copper gas lantern with a pilot tube constructed of copper that was found to be noncompliant with NFPA 54.5.6.3.2 as there are concerns of hydrogen sulfide in the gas composition. The applicant has indicated the local board of health and plumbing inspector have been notified.
