DECISION

RAZIELA, INC. DBA PLAINVILLE LIQUORS
35-37 SOUTH STREET

Raziela, Inc. dba Plainville Liquors (the "Licensee") holds an alcohol license issued pursuant to M.G.L. c. 138, §15. The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission (the "Commission") held a hearing on Tuesday, October 15, 2013, regarding an alleged violation of 204 CMR 2.05 (2) Permitting an Illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: c. 138 §34 Sale or Delivery of an Alcoholic Beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age. Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the licensee stipulated to the violation alleged in Investigator Teehan's Report.

The following documents are in evidence:

1. Licensee's Stipulation of Facts; and
2. Investigator Teehan's Compliance Check Field Report dated May 15, 2013.

There is one (1) audio recording of this hearing.

FACTS

1. On Wednesday, May 15, 2013, at approximately 5:39 p.m., Investigators Kenny and Teehan conducted an investigation of the business operation of Raziela, Inc. dba Plainville Liquors.
2. An underage operative, working with investigators, purchased an alcoholic beverage for one dollar (\$1.00). The underage operative was not asked for identification.





CONCLUSION

Based on the evidence, the Commission finds the licensee violated 204 CMR 2.05 (2) Permitting an Illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: c. 138 §34 Sale or Delivery of an Alcoholic Beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age. As the licensee has been in business for nineteen (19) years and has had no previous violations, the Commission issues a **WARNING**.
