The petitioner for the Worcester County Sheriff's Office is seeking relief from 248 CMR 3.04 Materials, to allow the use of a non-code compliant repair coupling on a 4" gas line. This is a post-installation variance. State inspector O'Reilly and the Board of Health have been notified.

24-PV-76, David Sisson, 1600 Shawsheen Street, Tewksbury

The petitioner is seeking relief from 248 CMR 10.10 Table 1, Minimum Facilities for Building Occupancy, to allow a reduction in fixtures in their unheated storage building. The local inspector and Board of Health have been notified.
