1-NFPA -2 review- Members reviewed and motioned to adopt NFPA 2-2023. Legal counsel noted that the adoption can be generally limited to fuel gas uses.

Vote: WT to approve, JW seconded

Results: Unanimously approved

2- 2021 IFGC Chapter 7, review- Members reviewed and found that NFPA-2-2023 was sufficiently detailed that adoption of a small portion of the IFGC was unnecessary.

Vote: WT to approve using NPFA-2-2023 only, JW seconded

Results: Unanimously approved

3-Review 248 CMR 5.05(8)(g) (1&2)

Members agreed to return to this item at a later time.

Vote: WT to table, JC seconded Results: Unanimously approved

4. NFPA-54-12- 10.12-248 CMR 5.10- Adding a shutoff upstream and a union downstream of the fire protection/ suppression valve

Possible Language- A Product-Accepted shutoff shall be installed in close proximity upstream to the Fire Protection / Suppression valve. A union shall be placed downstream of the fire protection/ suppression valve and solenoid valve.

Vote: JC to approve, JW seconded Results: Unanimously approved

5. NFPA-54-12- 10.12-248 CMR 5.10- Alternative Method for the fire protection/suppression valve.

Legal Counsel provided draft language for consideration:

All gas valves shall be mechanical type with manual reset unless a fire official has approved an alternative method per 527 CMR 1.00: Massachusetts Comprehensive Fire Safety Code. (current reference is 527 CMR 1.05, Chapter 5)

Vote: WT to approve, JC seconded Results: Unanimously approved

6. NFPA-54-12-5.7.5 Meter Identification

No action taken, addressed in NFPA-54-12/24 5.7.5

7. Review Board Policy from 2017 Adjustment and Replacement of Gas Controls. New language to 248 CMR 3.05 1 (c) 3 Permits and Inspections A permit shall not be required for simple disconnecting and reconnecting a gas appliance **ONLY** for the sole purpose of alteration, repair or replacement gas controls after the main control valve for said appliance.

Vote: HK to approve, JC seconded Results: Unanimously approved

8. 248 CMR 7.03 11 (c) 1-2- Requiring vents for all main Gas Regulators. The Chairman suggested language for 248 CMR 7.03-(11) removing the requirement of a vent limiter for a zero governor. The Chairman proposed to require venting to the outdoors of all main gas regulators regardless of type, even if a zero governor.

Vote: JC to approve, JW

Results: Unanimously approved
