  - 1- Participants and Board Counsel Kilb discussed the Gas Venting Listening Session of August 7, 2024. It was noted that the listening session was only sparsely attended, however, the focus of the participants was on concerns regarding inconsistency in enforcement as well as opinions regarding utilizing non-accepted PVC piping for certain appliance replacements.

Board counsel discussed past drafted language that would include certifications regarding existing piping but expressed legal concerns regarding exceptions to the product acceptance requirement. The chair opened the matter up to the public, Peter Defreitas, an inspector and instructor of inspector education, spoke regarding difficulties with existing installations. Members discussed different options for allowing existing piping to remain in an appliance replacement, however, no consensus was reached.

Counsel agreed to create legally acceptable language for review at future meetings.

The subcommittee did not review NFPA 58 or 248 CMR 7.00.

Participants agreed to meet again on August 28, 2024 at 1 p.m.
