1- Approve additional carbon monoxide protection language Participants discussed and approved the following code language- change is highlighted.

<u>9.1.23 Carbon Monoxide Protection</u>. No installation or replacement of a vented gas appliance shall be permitted unless a battery powered or electrically hard wired carbon monoxide detector is present on the same floor as the appliance or on the next adjacent floor when the appliance is located in a crawl space or uninhabited and unconditioned attic space, unless the appliance is located in a detached, uninhabitable garage. For all residential dwellings, a carbon monoxide detector must also be present on each habitable level of the dwelling. These requirements shall not be deemed to waive any additional requirements imposed by M.G.L. c. 148 § 26F¹/₂.

(8) Amend sub-section 9.2.1 by inserting the following at the end of the subsection:

Sufficient clearance must also be provided to allow the total replacement of the appliance or equipment.
