Variances

24-PV-200, Charlie Cashin, 492 Sutton Street, North Andover

The petitioner is seeking relief from 248 CMR 10.10 Recreational Facilities, to allow the construction of a children's lacrosse program facility without the required showers. This is a post-installation variance, and the Board of Health and local inspector have been notified.

The petitioner initially was not present when the matter was called by the chair.

Vote: HK to table, DK seconded

Results: Unanimously tabled

The petitioner later appeared, he indicated that the relief was sought because the engineers hired to design the installation failed to adhere to the plumbing code.

2nd Vote: HK to deny,

Results: Unanimously denied

24-PV-201, Gerald Sullivan, 271 Church Street, Clinton

The petitioner for the Council on Aging is seeking relief from 248 CMR 10.10 Table 1, to allow a reduction in the fixtures required for their proposed fitness area renovation project. The Board of Health and local inspector have been notified. Members debated whether a sufficient number of fixtures were provided for the installation.

Vote: HK to approve, JC seconded

Results: HK, JC, BK, JW, WT, RA, SB, DK to approve, JM to deny, approved by majority vote of 8 to 1.

24-PV-202, Dave Taggart, 140 First Street, Cambridge

The petitioner is seeking relief from 248 CMR 10.15 (9) (a), to allow the installation of a discharge pump for a RODI system that cannot drain by gravity. The Board of Health and local inspector have been notified.

The local inspector appeared and told the Board that this request was being sought due to designer preference, there was no hardship in his opinion.

Vote: HK to deny, JW seconded Results: Unanimously denied

24-PV-203, David Flynn, 53/55 Watertown Street, Lexington

The petitioner is seeking relief from 248 CMR 10.05 (2), 10.08(g)(1) and 10.17(9) to install a running trap on a sanitary drainpipe. The Board of Health and local inspector have been notified.

Vote: WT to approve with cleanouts and an engineered stamp drawing, HK

seconded

Results: Unanimously approved

24-PV-204, Davis Patel, 266 Washington Street, Attleboro

The petitioner is seeking relief from 248 CMR 10.10 Table 1, to allow a reduction in fixtures for their 2,000sqf retail marijuana establishment. The Board of Health and local inspector have been notified.

It was noted that the establishment can monitor bathroom usage for security purposes.

Vote: DK to deny, JW seconded.

Results: WT, DK, JW, HK, JC, SB to deny; BK, RA, to approve, JM abstained variance is denied by majority vote – 5 to 2 with 1 abstention.

24-PV-210, Blake Lukis, 50 Elm Street, Dedham

The petitioner for the Dedham-Westwood Water District is seeking relief from 248 CMR 10.10 Table 1, to allow the construction of a 4,659 sqf accessory storage building without the required restroom, drinking water station and mop sink. The Board of Health and local inspector have been notified.

Board members discussed the building size and usage and agreed the building is large enough to accommodate the required fixtures.

Vote: WT to deny, JC seconded Results: Unanimously denied

24-PV-199, Gregory Riley, 40 Lackey Dam Road, Uxbridge

The petitioner is seeking relief from 248 CMR 10.10 Table 1, to allow the construction of a 420,000 sqft warehouse without the required showers. The Board of Health and local inspector have been notified.

The petitioner was not present when the matter was called by the chair.

Vote: HK to table, DK seconded Results: Unanimously tabled
