The executive director reported that American Podiatric Medical Licensing Examination (APMLE) exam reports are now sent directly to the board vendor for application processing. He noted that his staff has processed eleven podiatric residency applications for limited licensure.

Discussion:

- DPH 140 CMR 2.00 on requirements applicable to all health care providers licensed by boards within the Department of Public Health – VOTE

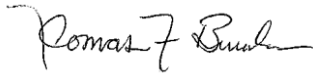
Director of Policy Jonathan Dillon offered a brief presentation on proposed regulation 140 CMR 2.00. The regulation would prohibit Massachusetts licensed health care providers from reporting medical debt to consumer reporting agencies and require health care providers in the Commonwealth to include a provision in contracts with debt collectors that prohibits debt collectors from reporting debt to consumer reporting agencies. Mr. Dillon requested board approval of the regulation to progress to public comment period.

Following discussion, Dr. Murano moved to approve DPH 140 CMR 2.00 to progress to public comment period. Dr. Schneider seconded. Roll call vote: Dr. Murano – “Yes”; Dr. Kelley – “No”; Dr. Holtzman – No”; Dr. Schneider – “Yes”. The motion did not pass.

Adjourn:

At 11:00 a.m. Dr. Murano moved to leave the general session meeting and enter closed session pursuant to M.G.L. c. 112 §65C for investigative conference and, following closed session, not return to general session and adjourn the meeting. Dr. Holtzman seconded. The motion passed by roll call vote: Dr. Murano – “Yes”; Dr. Kelley – “Yes”; Dr. Holtzman – “Yes”; Dr. Schneider – “Yes”.
