
Dear Friends,

Last evening, the Department of Conservation and Recreation (DCR) held a public meeting at the City of Cambridge Main Library to present, and obtain feedback on, preliminary recommendations for landscape rehabilitation, as well as options for walls and pathways of the Southern Section, of Lowell Memorial Park. The design is funded by DCR and the City of Cambridge Community Preservation Act Committee, through DCR's Partnership Matching Funds program, and has benefitted from technical support and advocacy provided by the Cambridge Plant & Garden Club.
