

NEEDS IMPROVEMENT

- Unknown or under-utilized or lack of promotion
- Gate and entrance are not inviting
- Programs are inconsistent or uninteresting
- Under-staffed or under-funded
- Closed or short opening hours
- Inadequate signage and informational displays
- Limited (outdoor) seating







Roxbury Heritage State Park Project LANDSCAPE PROGRAM Goals & Opportunities

- Make point(s) of arrival clear and welcoming
- Make park landscape more conducive to community gathering
- Emphasize the view
- Integrate the house with the landscape and exhibits
- Provide multi-generational opportunities
- Use native plants and building materials
- Accommodate maintenance and management capabilities








Roxbury Heritage State Park Project



- Main entrance to house located between house and annex
- Performance space located near front door of house, outside perimeter fence, oriented toward the street
- Perimeter fence lowered to 4'; extended full length of park property
- Parking area set back from street; resized to minimize pedestrian conflicts along Gay Street walkway
- Orchard set along north side of property line as screen for middle ground views (O' Bryant School roof)
- Looping walkway through park, with stops at View Master site, and at focal point
- Urban agriculture area on east side of property expanded



Roxbury Heritage State Park Project



- Paved gathering space between front of house and street
- Main entrance to house through new welcome space (addition to existing annex)
- Performance space in existing location but expanded to include several walled seating terraces
- Perimeter fence lowered to 4' and extended full length of park property
- Parking re-sized to minimize pedestrian conflicts
- Expanded community gardening area to north of parking lot
- Looping walkway through park passing View Master and stage



Roxbury Heritage State Park Project



- Historic front walk to front door of house retained and enhanced
- Performance space close to house and annex
- Perimeter fence lowered to 4' and extended full length of park
- Parking area set back from street; resized to prevent pedestrian conflicts along the Gay Street walkway
- Existing fruit orchard retained and supplemented
- Natural inclusion-style playground constructed at former amphitheater site
- Central feature (sculpture, View Master, interpretive element located on park lawn, and accessed by walkways from parking area, performance space, and Roxbury Street sidewalk



Roxbury Heritage State Park Project **ARCHITECTURE**

Goals & Opportunities

• Link to the historic house, its location to the history of Roxbury, the land & surrounding landmarks

- "The house is an exhibit"
- Create an easily identifiable entryway that is part of the visitors' experience
- Integrate the house, physically & programmatically, to the landscape & outdoor programs
- Support the building's use as a community resource
- Combine public uses & DCR uses in a harmonious & flexible manner


•Build repairs & upgrades to further attract area residents & visitors

Constraints

- Modifications to the historic house are limited given:
 - historic status of the house
 - original residential use
 - age of the structure
 - budget limitations

House Entrance





CONCEPT A




Design Features

- a. Incorporate brick-green wall by the Annex to the building entrance experience
- b. Atrium between the Historic House and the Annex creates Building Entrance and additional area for exhibits
- c. Security Fence at building edges only. Ornamental fence along the park edges
- d. 1st floor is primarily for public use, 2nd floor for semi-public use
- e. Limited public access to the basement and 3rd floor
- New Restroom: 1st Floor Annex


Roxbury Heritage State Park Project EXHIBIT DESIGN Goals and Opportunities

• Create an immersive exhibit experience where all visitors feel they are welcomed.

- Honor Roxbury's revolutionary & recent past in exhibits.
- Highlight the community and its efforts to maintain its identity.

• Show the wide diversity of people who have called Roxbury home.

- Create a way for residents to add to a community history database.
- Provide a system for history focused community art exhibits.
- Reinforce the Department identity at the site and house entrance.
- Enhance site experience through selective interpretation.
- Create robust exhibit systems that require little maintenance.
- Provide useful content for interpretive volunteers to engage visitors.
- Use the Heritage State Park as a way to link all of the significant historic sites in Roxbury.





Roxbury Heritage State Park Project EXHIBIT DESIGN

Constraints

- Limited staff means exhibits must be self-guided and easy to maintain.
- Setting in historic house means limited space as well as constraints on interior remodeling.
- Some of Roxbury's history has limited documentation.






Roxbury Heritage State Park Project EXHIBIT DESIGN
