## **Project Goals – Winthrop Shore Drive**

- Improve sidewalks and install sidewalk amenities at major entrances
- Reconstruct roadway
- Improve drainage/storm water management
- Improve accessibility
- Enhance ocean side lighting
- Create new Beach Road Gateway.





# **Project Requirements – Winthrop Shore Drive**

- Two-way traffic
- On-street parking
- Adequate width for Fire Department vehicles and truck traffic
- Emergency response route.

# What you told us

- Extend the sidewalk replacement to the corner of Grovers Ave.
- Use thermoplastic markings instead of paint for durability
- Don't have bump outs eliminating too much parking or making turns difficult
- Replace sidewalk, benches, seawall cap railing and fence in Highlands
- Use pedestrian lighting for increased visibility
- More green space
- Modify parking regulations



## Sidewalk Improvements and Amenities at Major Entrances

- Create an additional 24,000 SF of concrete sidewalks, increasing widths on the ocean side from the current 8' to either 11' or 15' (at bump-outs), and on residential side from 5' to 6'
- Install amenities at 5 major entrances Coral St./Bathhouse, Pearl Ave\*., Cutler St., Sturgis St., Charles St.
  - 10 additional benches
  - 4 bicycle racks
  - 4 drinking fountains
  - 4 shower towers.

\* Pearl Ave. amenities were installed previously during Winthrop Beach Shore Protection project.

# New Stormwater Management System -Advantages

- Similar to system in place at Revere Beach in operation for 8 years
- Chambers set at same elevation allowing for water to spread evenly to maximize exfiltration rate
- Does not rely on discharge at beach if outlet is clogged it will not affect water draining from roadway
- Ability to correct low spots in roadway and ensure drainage to new catch basins



## Accessibility Improvements – Sidewalks/Roadway

- Narrowing of traveling roadways to 11' provides sufficient space for 6' walkway on residential side (as opposed to current 5'), allowing 3' of passable space in areas of obstructions, such as hydrants, sign-posts, and utility poles at street corners
- New intersection design at all cross-streets, including raised crosswalks to meet slope requirements for accessibility
- New wheelchair ramps on each side of the roadway.



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#### **Emergency Response Routes**





#### **Reconstruct Roadway**

- Slightly narrower travel lanes help reduce speed
- Full depth reconstruction is anticipated to provide a 20year design life
