The Recycling Loan Fund 2019 Update

Purpose

- Stimulate recycling markets, business development and job growth.
- Provide competitive loans to recycling businesses – entities that may otherwise experience hurdles to traditional financing.
- Assist recycling businesses in leveraging additional financing.

Overview

- Eligible activities:
 - Collecting or separating recyclable materials.
 - Reuse, processing, composting or converting recyclable materials into marketable products.
 - Manufacturing products that use recycled materials.
 - Wholesaling or retailing of recycled feedstocks or products containing a significant percentage of recycled materials.
 - Businesses such as food processors that are not recycling or composting businesses, but that generate food waste, may be eligible to develop on-site composting or digestion operations for food waste diversion.
- Permanent working capital, refinancing, real estate, machinery and equipment, acquisition financing.
- Terms up to ten years.
- Loans from \$50,000 to \$500,000 (up to \$1.5 million for anaerobic digestion projects).

Background

- Revolving fund.
- Established in 1995.
- Capitalized with ~ \$5 million in funds from MassDEP.
- Administered by BDC Capital (formerly the Massachusetts Business Development Corporation).

History

- Provided 74 loans for a total of over \$16 million.
- First anaerobic digestion project funded in 2013. There have since been three others (fourth upcoming in February).
- Massachusetts Department of Energy Resources provided additional \$3 million in funding.


History

- 54 different companies have received loans:
 - Anaerobic digestion (4)
 - Composting (6)
 - Construction and demolition materials (6)
 - Electronics (3)
 - Hauling (3)
 - Metals (7)
 - Paper (8)
 - Plastics (8)

Other: glass (1), office furniture (1), polystyrene (1) processing (1), textiles (2), tires (2), wood (1)

- RLF contract with BDC Capital renewed for three years with renewal options.

 - Organics/food materials
 - Mattresses
 - Plastics: film or bulky rigid
 - Glass: container, plate or windshield
 - Construction and demolition materials
