Norco Sportman's Club, Inc. (the "Licensee") holds an alcohol license issued pursuant to M.G.L. c. 138, §12. The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission (the "Commission") held a hearing on Tuesday, May 14, 2013, regarding an alleged violation of M.G.L. c. 138 §23 – Sale of alcoholic beverages other than those purchased from a licensee under §18 or §19 or from a holder of a special license under §22a (5 counts). Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the licensee stipulated to the violation alleged in Investigator Doyle's Report.

The following documents are in evidence:

- 1. Licensee's Stipulation of Facts;
- 2. Investigator Doyle's Investigative Report dated November 1, 2012;
- 3. Invoices from wholesaler Atlas Distributing Inc. to Licensee (7 pages); and
- 4. Five Bottles of Liquor.
- A. Invoices from Four Massachusetts Alcohol Wholesalers to Licensee (6 pages).

There is one (1) audio recording of this hearing.

## **FACTS**

- 1. On Thursday, November 1, 2012, at approximately 5:15 p.m., Investigators Bailey and Doyle investigated the business operation of Norco Sportman's Club, Inc. to determine the manner in which their business was being conducted.
- 2. Investigators conducted an inspection of the bar area and observed five bottles with what appeared to be glue residue in the size and shape of a retail price sticker.
- 3. Investigators took inventory of these bottles:
  - > 1.0L Dekuyper Butterscotch Schnapps;
  - > 1.75L Dr. McGillicuddy's Liqueur;
  - > 1.75L Jim Beam Bourbon;
  - > 1.75L Myers Dark Rum; and
  - > 1.75L Wild Turkey Bourbon.

4. Investigators spoke to Jay Fitzgerald, a member of the Board of Directors, and informed him of the violation and that a report would be filed with the Chief Investigator for further action.

## CONCLUSION

Based on the evidence, the Commission finds the licensee violated of M.G.L. c. 138 §23 – Sale of alcoholic beverages other than those purchased from a licensee under §18 or §19 or from a holder of a special license under §22a (5 counts). As the licensee has been in business since 1947 and has had no previous violations, the Commission issues a **WARNING**.
