Public notice is hereby given of the Chapter 91 Permit application by the Town of Nahant for placement of beach nourishment material (32,500 square feet) at 0 Nahant Road within Flowed Tidelands of Nahant Bay in the Town of Nahant, Essex County. The proposed project has preliminarily been determined to be a Water-Dependent Use.

The Department will consider all written comments on this application received by August 3, 2026 (Public Comments Deadline). Failure of any aggrieved person or group of ten (10) citizens or more to submit written comments to the Waterways Regulation Program by the Public Comments Deadline will result in the waiver of any right to an adjudicatory hearing in accordance with 310 CMR 9.13(4)(c). The group of citizens must include at least five (5) citizens who are residents of the municipality in which the proposed project is located. A public hearing may be held at the request of the Municipal Official.
