Opinion Letter

Re: Turf Installation Crews –Job Classification and Prevailing Wage

Dear XXXXXX,

This letter is written in response to your request for a determination of the proper job classification for workers whose duties involve the construction of an outside athletic field, with synthetic turf ,on public projects subject to the prevailing wage law, G. L. c. 149, § §26 and 27.

In determining the appropriate job classification and prevailing wage for such public works, DLS looks to the collective agreements and understandings in the private construction industry between organized labor and employers. G.L. c.149, § 26. The tasks associated with the layout and construction of an athletic field represent the gravamens of a laborer's toil: site preparation, clearing, excavating, digging, blasting, laying underground pipe conduit and drainage, backfilling, compacting, grading, loading, handling, and conveying sand, fill and turf. It makes very little difference to these clearly defined, traditional tasks whether the turf finally laid on the laborer's well-prepared field is real or synthetic

Furthermore, according to the collective bargaining agreement of the Laborers Union¹, Article XXII, section 35, "the installation of artificial turf and turf like materials along with the cleanup...and related work at athletic fields" falls within the trade autonomy of the Laborers Union. Moreover, it is the prevailing practice that such work is done by laborers. Thus, the appropriate prevailing wage for turf installers on public projects is that of a laborer.

Laborers hourly rates currently reported to this office, as of the date of this letter, are as follows:

Zone 1 - \$56.35 Zone 2 - \$51.25
