**NOTICE OF SUSPENSION**

After a hearing on May 13, 2014, the Commission finds Baile Liam Corp. dba Clash of the Ash violated 204 CMR 2.05 (2) - Permitting an Illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: c.138, §34C- Person under the age of twenty-one (21) in possession of an alcoholic beverage (5 Counts).

The Commission **suspends the licensee's license for a total of eight (8) days to be served. The suspension shall commence on Wednesday, July 9, 2014, and terminate on Wednesday, July 16, 2014.** The license will be delivered to the Local Licensing Board or its designee on Wednesday, July 9, 2014 at 9:00 A.M. It will be returned to the licensee Thursday, July 17, 2014.

You are advised that pursuant to the provisions of M.G.L. c.138 §23, you may petition the Commission to accept an offer in compromise in lieu of suspension within twenty (20) calendar days following such notice of such suspension. If accepted, you may pay a fine using the enclosed form. All checks must be certified and accompanied by the enclosed form, which must be signed by a Massachusetts Licensed Accountant.

You are advised that you have the right to appeal this decision under M.G.L. c. 30A to Superior Court within thirty (30) days upon receipt of this notice.

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**DECISION**

**BAILE LIAM CORP. DBA CLASH OF THE ASH**

Baile Liam Corp. dba Clash of the Ash (the "Licensee") holds an alcohol license issued pursuant to M.G.L. c. 138, §12. The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission (the "Commission") held a hearing on Tuesday, May 13, 2014, regarding an alleged violation of 204 CMR 2.05 (2)- Permitting an illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: c. 138, §34C- Possession of an alcoholic beverage by a person under 21 years of age (5 counts). Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the licensee stipulated to the violation alleged in Investigator Doyle's Report.

The following documents are in evidence:

1. Investigator Doyle's Investigative Report dated November 27, 2013;
2. Licensee's Stipulation of Facts; and
3. RMV Printouts for Underage Patrons.

There is one (1) audio recording of this hearing, and one (1) witness testified.

The Commission took administrative notice of the Licensee's records.

**FACTS**

1. On Wednesday, November 27, 2013, at approximately 11:00 p. m., Investigators Doyle and Carey, along with Quincy Police Department officers, conducted an investigation of the business operation Baile Liam Corp. dba Clash of the Ash to determine the manner in which its business was being conducted.
2. Investigators entered the licensed premises through the front entrance while Quincy Police Detective Lieutenant Turowski, Detective Dentremont, and Officer Leuchte entered the premises through the rear entrance.
3. Investigators observed several youthful appearing individuals in possession of what appeared to be alcoholic beverages.
4. Investigators and Quincy Police Officers identified themselves and asked the individuals for identification.

5. Shannon Coleman, actual date of birth [REDACTED] (age 20) was in possession of a bottle of Budweiser Light beer. Ms. Coleman presented investigators with a MA Driver's License in the name of Jennifer Mazzeo, date of birth [REDACTED] (age 24), which she had used for entry into the premises.
6. When investigators noted the height difference between Ms. Coleman and that given on Ms. Mazzeo's license and pointed this difference to Ms. Coleman, she produced her true MA Driver's License.
7. Kennedy Harding, actual date of birth [REDACTED] (age 18) was in possession of a Red Bull and vodka mixed drink. Ms. Harding presented investigators with a MA Driver's License in the name of Paige Keenan, date of birth [REDACTED] (age 21), which she had used for entry into the premises.
8. When investigators noted that the Keenan license expired [REDACTED] Ms. Harding produced her true MA Driver's License.
9. Thomas Garland, actual date of birth [REDACTED] (age 19) was in possession of a rum and cola mixed drink. Mr. Garland presented Quincy Detective Lieutenant Turowski with his true MA Driver's License. Mr. Garland stated that he entered the premises through the rear entrance and he was not asked for identification.
10. Investigators and Lieutenant Turowski spoke to the manager on duty and owner, Bernard Connaughton, and identified the underage individuals and their identifications used for entry.
11. Investigators informed Mr. Connaughton of the issue with the rear entrance to the licensed premises. Mr. Connaughton stated that he usually has a staff member there checking for identifications.
12. Investigators and Quincy Police Officers continued to identify themselves to other youthful looking individuals in possession of what appeared to be alcoholic beverages.
13. Arthur Wahlberg, actual date of birth [REDACTED] (age 20) was in possession of a bottle of Budweiser Light beer. Mr. Wahlberg presented investigators with his true MA Driver's License. Mr. Wahlberg stated that he entered the premises through the rear entrance and he was not asked for identification.
14. Brendan Glynn, actual date of birth [REDACTED] (age 20) was in possession of a bottle of Budweiser Light beer. Mr. Glynn presented Lieutenant Turowski with a MA Driver's License in the name of Scott Whitcomb, date of birth [REDACTED] (age 25), which he had used for entry into the premises.
15. When Lieutenant Turowski noted that the Whitcomb license expired in 2011, Mr. Glynn produced his true MA Driver's License.
16. Investigators advised Mr. Connaughton of the violation and that a report would be submitted to the Chief Investigator for further action.


### CONCLUSION

Based on the evidence, the Commission finds the licensee violated 204 CMR 2.05 (2)- Permitting an illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: c. 138, §34C- Possession of an alcoholic beverage by a person under 21 years of age (5 counts).

Therefore, the Commission **suspends the license for eighteen (18) days of which eight (8) days will be served and ten (10) days will be held in abeyance for a period of two (2) years provided no further violations of Chapter 138 or Commission Regulations occur.**


