MassDOT invites you to a virtual public information meeting to learn about the Boston and Albany Corridor Service Development Plan (SDP). The SDP will study how passenger rail service on the Boston and Albany Corridor would operate and identify the steps needed to get there. MassDOT is working to expand passenger rail service on the Boston and Albany Corridor as part of Compass Rail, the Commonwealth's vision to expand intercity train travel. The Boston and Albany Corridor has been accepted into the Federal Railroad Administration's Corridor Identification and Development Program, a major milestone towards enhancing train service to benefit communities across the Commonwealth.
