FTA Help Improve Prosperity for Everyone (HOPE) Grant Program

FTA announced the Pioneer Valley Transit Authority will receive \$680,000 for a transit review and improvement planning study. The study will provide recommendations for improved transit services and facilities, new routes, modern fare collection systems, and integrating low or no-emission buses—all to reduce travel times and create greater access jobs for rural residents in western Massachusetts.

Rail:

East-West Passenger Rail Study

The Advisory Committee for the East-West Passenger Rail Study met on September 30 from to review analysis of the three remaining alternatives, including updated ridership, cost estimates, and community and environmental impacts and discuss the next steps to complete the study, including the draft and final report.

Construction

- The Rail Division worked closely with the Highway Division to install a much-needed underpass under the mainline tracks in Springfield during the COVID-19 shutdown of the Vermonter. The community will be safely connected at this location.
- The Rail Division worked closely with Cape Cod Regional Transit Authority to access the Hyannis Rail Yard with a new access road and in return provided them with more parking spaces. This new access road also gave the Highway Division additional property to improve Route 28 with a new grade crossing.
- Construction for replacing three and repairing three bridges has started on the Berkshire Line. This is being done prior to installing new continuous welded rail for this line.
