C & J CUISINE, INC. DBA C & J CUISINE

C & J Cuisine, Inc. dba C & J Cuisine (the "Licensee") holds an all alcohol license issued pursuant to M.G.L. c. 138, §12. The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission (the "Commission") held a hearing on Tuesday, December 13, 2011, regarding an alleged violation of M.G.L. c.138, §34. Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the licensee stipulated to the violation alleged in Investigator John Carey's Compliance Check Field Report.

The following documents are in evidence:

1. Licensee's Stipulation of Facts; and
2. Compliance Check Field Report dated August 3, 2011.

FACTS


1. On August 3, 2011 at approximately 6:37 p.m., Commission Investigators investigated the business operation C & J Cuisine, Inc. dba C & J Cuisine.
2. An underage operative, working with the investigators, purchased a Budweiser can for three dollars (\$3.00). The underage operative was not asked for identification.
3. The under-aged operative is nineteen (19) years old, with a date of birth of May 24, 1992.
4. Administrative review of the file indicates the licensee has been at this location since 2007 and has no prior violations.

CONCLUSION

Based on the evidence, the Commission finds the licensee violated Massachusetts General Laws c. 138, §34. The Commission **suspends the license for three (3) days of which three (3) days will be held in abeyance for a period of two (2) years provided no further violations of Chapter 138 or Commission Regulations occur.**


