#### **DECISION**

FERNANDEZ BROTHERS LIQUORS III, INC. D/B/A FERNANDEZ BROTHERS LIQUORS 1065 NORTH MAIN ST. RANDOLPH, MA 02368

LICENSE#: 1008-00055

Fernandez Brothers Liquors III, Inc. d/b/a Fernandez Brothers Liquors (the "Licensee") holds an alcohol license issued pursuant to M.G.L. c. 138, § 15. The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission (the "Commission") held a hearing on Tuesday, August 14, 2018, regarding an alleged violation of 204 CMR 2.05 (2) – Permitting an illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: M.G.L. c. 138, § 34 – Sale or delivery of an alcoholic beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age. Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the Licensee stipulated to the violation alleged in Investigator Watson's Report.

The following documents are in evidence:

- 1. Investigator Watson's Compliance Check Field Report; and
- 2. Licensee's Stipulation of Facts.

There is one (1) audio recording of this hearing.

The Commission took Administrative Notice of the Licensee's record.

# **FACTS**

- 1. On Thursday, May 17, 2018, at approximately 7:11 p.m., Investigators Temple and Watson ("Investigators") investigated the business of Fernandez Brothers Liquors III, Inc. d/b/a Fernandez Brothers Liquors.
- 2. An underage operative, working with Investigators, purchased from the Licensee an alcoholic beverage, a 25-ounce bottle of Bud Light beer, for two dollars and seventy-five cents (\$2.75). The underage operative was not asked for identification.

## **CONCLUSION**

Based on the evidence, the Commission finds the Licensee violated 204 CMR 2.05 (2) Permitting an illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: M.G.L. c. 138, § 34 – Sale or delivery of an alcoholic beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age. Therefore, the Commission suspends the license for one (1) day which will be held in abeyance for a period of two (2) years provided no further violations of Chapter 138 or Commission Regulations occur.
