Dear Ashley,

The purpose of this letter is to provide an update on the status of the findings and corrective actions identified by the Department of Public Health's (the Department) Early Intervention Division (El Division) reported in the Cyclical Monitoring report to RCS Behavioral and Educational Consulting dated January 10, 2025. Based upon the El Division's analysis of the revised policies and procedures and/or evidence submitted by RCS, as well as subsequent data pulled from the Early Intervention Client System on 7/1/2025 for all relevant requirements, the El Division has determined that RCS has taken the necessary steps to address and resolve the findings of noncompliance and the required corrective actions outlined in the monitoring report.

The chart included in this letter summarizes the monitoring component, finding, required actions, EI Division analysis, and status of finding(s) based on the evidence received from RCS.

The EI Division appreciates RCS' continued efforts to improve the implementation of IDEA Part C and the development and implementation of a reasonably designed system which ensures compliance and improving results for infants and toddlers with disabilities. The EI Division notes that having a consistent and transparent system for identifying and correcting noncompliance, particularly noncompliance that impacts the delivery of early intervention services in accordance with individualized family service plans, and dispute resolutions systems that protect the rights of parents, are essential elements to ensuring improved results for infants and toddlers with disabilities. In accordance with the Massachusetts Department of Public Health's Reimbursement Policy Manual for Early Intervention and Autism Services, charge claims and encounter claims are required to match the service log data on the Progress Note in the DPH EI Client system (pg.16), and Charge

charge and encounter claim requirements. The EI division reviewed a total of 5 child records for satisfactory demonstration intervention services under (100%) of charge and encounter part C of the Act within the claim submission. A total of 1 of these records demonstrated evidence that the program did not corresponding service log data for an encounter claim.

> Additionally, while the EI division did not find evidence of practice, the EI Division found that one of the program's policies included language regarding requirements of payment, which are not in accordance with the provision of IDEA Part C services, under 34 C.F.R
