3 Major Elements




SHELTERING: Public facilities used for regional shelters during & after disasters

What is the ARC's Relationship with MEMA?





MEMA and ARC are partners that communicate regularly to support large responses in cities and towns.

Both groups rely on each other to coordinate and augment resources when requested by the city/town.

How Can ARC Help Me as an Emergency Manager?





ARC partners with other organizations to provide 24/7 coverage to assist people displaced by disasters like home fires, hurricanes, blizzards, floods, etc.

Assistance may include emergency financial assistance, shelter, food, clothing, toiletry items, health services, mental health services, and recovery caseworkers.

What Types of Shelters Are There?



Independently Managed Shelters

- Not supported by ARC
- Popup, ad hoc or spontaneous shelters

Partner-Managed Shelters

- Supported if following ARC principles
 - Human and material resources
 - Subject matter expertise

ARC-Managed Shelters

- Managed by ARC in cooperation with partners
 - Facility owners, niche providers, staff acting as ARC

What is the Difference Between Regional and Town Shelters?



Regional Shelters

- ARC supports clients during a regional weather event
- Anyone is allowed to stay regardless of residency.
- ARC prioritizes Regional Shelters

Town Shelters

- Stood up for local weather events
- *Not* prioritized by ARC
- Supported only when volunteers and materials are available

What Services Does ARC Provide to Shelter Residents?



Health and Welfare

- Food and drink
- Comfort/hygiene kits
- Disaster Health Services
- Disaster Mental Health
- Disaster Spiritual Support
- *Casework

Financial Aid

- *Emergency financial assistance (i.e., debit card)
- *Referrals to other support agencies

What Equipment Does ARC Provide for Shelters?



ARC can supplement Town's supplies and equipment

- Cots and blankets
- Durable medical equipment
 - Bariatric cots and wedge pillows
 - Canes, walkers, and wheelchairs
- Sweatpants, sweatshirts, socks, shower shoes, etc.

Talk with your local Disaster Program Manager (DPM) to determine our collective capacity for various scenarios

What About Animals in Shelters?



ARC co-locates household pets whenever feasible Pets will not be allowed

- In the dormitory
- Food preparation/serving/eating areas
- Disaster Health Service areas
- Designated child recreation areas
- Areas that would present health hazards
- Areas that would disrupt service delivery

What About Animals in Shelters?



Service Animal

A dog trained to perform tasks for an individual with a disability The task(s) must be directly related to the person's disability

Psychiatric Service Animal

A dog trained to sense an anxiety attack and take a specific action would qualify as a service animal

Emotional Support, Therapy, Comfort, Companion Animal These are not service animals

What About Animals in Shelters?



Service Animal

- Allowed to accompany its owner wherever they go
- Does not have to be documented, or wear a vest
- Cannot be asked to demonstrate its work
- If the client's disability is not obvious, staff may only ask
 - Is the animal a service animal required because of a disability?
 - What task or service is the animal trained to perform?
- The law requires staff to take the client at their word

What Type of Training is Available?
