### **Registration Requirements and Fees for Generators of Hazardous Waste**

The following Annual Compliance Assurance Fees (ACF) are invoiced for all generators of hazardous waste (HW) registered with an EPA permit ID classification of Large Quantity Generator (LQG) or Small Quantity Generator (SQG) of federal HW:

- LQG ACF = \$3,880
- SQG ACF = \$645

All facilities that generate and ship HW at levels regulated by 310 CMR 30.00 must apply for a HW generator permit (EPA ID) approved by MassDEP.

- This requirement includes permits for shipments made on a one-time or short-term basis, with **no exemptions**.
- A HW generator permit is considered a “permit in perpetuity” and will remain active and in effect until the generator files a request to deactivate it and indicates that they have suspended all generator activity.
- HW generators are responsible for all permit requirements which may include storage and reporting requirements, inspection activity, and the payment of annual compliance fees as required by 310 CMR 4.00. - Pursuant to Massachusetts Regulations in 310 CMR 30.06, it is the responsibility of the HW permit owner to promptly notify MassDEP of any changes in HW activity or generator status, and to deactivate the permit when it is no longer needed.
- MassDEP and EPA reserve the right to monitor and enforce false and inaccurate reporting of the generation, storage and shipping of HW as authorized by M.G.L. Chapter 21C and federal RCRA rules.
